Terry was born in Granby, NY or Auburn, NY about 1825 to 1829 he stood 5' 7" grey eyes and Auburn hair. He married Hannah Bradford on 15 June 1851. Terry M. Filley Enlisted in Company "G" of the 13th Michigan Infantry on 15 Dec 1861 for 3 years. He was signed up at Eaton Rapids by J.Slayton. this was most likely 1st Lt. Joshua or 2nd Lt. James B. both in Company F. of the thirteenth Michigan Infantry. He left behind Hannah (Bradford) Filley wife, his daughters Lydia, Caroline and his son Franklin Filley. His unit was

Organized at Kalamazoo, Michigan He mustered in on 17 Jan 1862 at Kalamazoo under ? Lt Neal Smith.? I have not found a Lt. Smith attached to the 13th Michigan or Captain Balch's Company. They left Michigan for Nashville, Tennessee, February 12, 1862 and were attached to 15th Brigade, 4th Division, Army of the Ohio, until March, 1862. They then were attached to the 20th Brigade, 6th Division, Army of the Ohio, until September, 1862. The thirteenth Marched from Nashville, Tennessee to Savannah, Tennessee to reinforce Army of the Tennessee, March 29-April 7, 1862. Terry reported sick to the convalescent's barracks and was left behind at Nashville 29 March 1862 on 14 April 1862 he was admitted with a complaint of Rheumatics being released 26 May 1862. though he was reported as present for May and June 1862

While on Sick Call the thirteenth participated at the Battle of Shiloh April 7 and Advance on and were at the siege of Corinth, Miss., April 29-May 30 and then they were in pursuit to Booneville June 1-12

On 16 Jun 1862 he returned to his company at Tuscumbia, Alabama to participate in Buell's operations in Northern Alabama and Middle Tennessee on the line of the Memphis & Charleston Railroad June to August 1862 they then Marched to Louisville, Ky., in pursuit of Bragg August 31-September 26 they were then engaged in the Pursuit of Bragg to Wild Cat, Kentucky from October 1st to the 16th. Finally they served Duty at Stevenson, Alabama. July 18 to August 31, 1862, they were employed building forts and stockades and guarding the railroad. He was left sick with Diarrhea and an injury at USA General Hospital at Columbia Kentucky 26 Oct 1862 and then sent to Hospital at Lebanon, Kentucky. He also was at #17 General Hospital Louisville, Kentucky with a complaint of Asthma on Nov 4, 1862

While on Sick Call the thirteenth joined the 20th Brigade, 6th Division, 2nd Corps, Army of the Ohio, to November, 1862.

They were at Nelson's Cross Roads on October 18 during their March to Nashville, Tennessee between October 22 and November 7, 1862.

Attached to the 3rd Brigade, 1st Division, Left Wing 14th Army Corps, Army of the Cumberland, to January, 1863.

Serving duty at Nashville, Tenn., till December 26.

They advance on Murfreesboro December 26-30

Terry returned on 2 Feb 1863 to Company G Thirteenth Michigan infantry. They were then attached to the 3rd Brigade, 1st Division, 21st Army Corps, serving until April, 1863. During that time he was at the Battle of Stone's River December 30-31, 1862 and January 1-3, 1863. On 9 Mar 1863 sent to Murfreesboro field Hospital complaining of "Debility" Returned to service May 1863. Duty at Murfreesboro till June

1st Brigade, 1st Division, 21st Army Corps, to October, 1863.

Middle Tennessee or Tullahoma Campaign June 23-July 7

At Hillsboro, Tenn., till August 16

The 13th was at the Battle of Chattanooga November 23-25

**Terry died at Hospital 21 in Richmond, Virginia of Chronic Diarrhea 22 Dec
1863 at Confederate States Military "P" Hospital. They list him as a 52 year
old Farmer**

The 13th completed the war with the following duty:

An interesting note:

Terry's Brother-in-law Hiram Bradford served in Company "F" of the 13th Michigan Infantry he survived dying 8 Nov 1878 buried at Oakwood Cemetery Eaton Rapids, Eaton, Michigan

Hannah's cousin James W. Hall served in Company "A" and "G" of the 8th Michigan Cavalry also survived dying 10 Oct 1931 buried at Edgewater Cemetery New Symria, Volusia, Florida

Hannah's Uncle, Timothy O. Hall enlisted 13 Nov 1861 in Company "D" of the 13th Michigan he survived, dying 13 May 1902 and was reported to have been buried in Kalamo, Eaton, Michigan. I have not found the burial site.

FINAL STATEMENT

VOLUNTEERS.

Check on Rebel Prison, Richmond, Va. Dec. 22^d 1863

NOTE 1.—Two of these certificates (or duplicates) are to be given to each Volunteer Soldier or drafted man who may be discharged previously to the discharge of his company, that he may at once receive from the Paymaster the pay, &c., due him; and the captain or other COMMISSIONED officer commanding the company will certify to the act of the delivery of the duplicate certificates; on these certificates the Soldier is "entitled to" his discharge, and should also present his discharge to the Paymaster to have the payment endorsed on it. The discharge is to be given back to the Soldier by the Paymaster; the latter only retaining as his voucher the duplicate certificates.

NOTE 2.—If the Soldier is entitled to pay for the use of his horse, the Company Commander will certify to that fact on the back of both these final statements, and also to the time he has pay due for having been so mounted on his own horse.

NOTE 3.—When a Soldier is furnished with final statements, his descriptive list, if he has one, should be taken up by the officer who gives the Soldier these statements, and endorsed with a statement to this effect by the officer. This endorsement should exhibit a full statement of the time for which the Soldier was allowed pay on his final statements, the clothing account, and all other charges against him or in his favor, so as to comprise a complete exhibit of his account. It will then be transmitted to the company commander of the Soldier, who will enter all the data necessary to a full understanding of the Soldier's account on the muster roll upon which the Soldier's discharge is reported. The descriptive list will then be destroyed. The object of this is, that the remaining portion of the Soldier's account may be settled upon the receipt of these muster rolls, and the Soldier receive any pay or allowances that may be due him at the time of his discharge, and which may not appear on his final statements from the fact that his descriptive list is incomplete. These accounts for back pay, &c., are settled by the 2d Auditor of the Treasury Department.

NOTE 4.—Charges for loss or injury to ordnance, horse equipments, and other miscellaneous charges, should appear under the heading of "Other Stoppages."

NOTE 5.—Bounty paid by State authorities, and not by the United States, will not be entered on this statement.

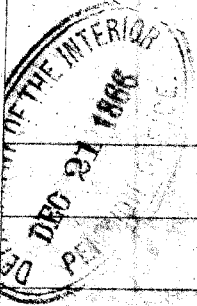



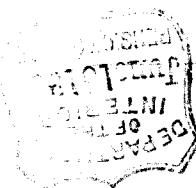
