#### **Special Projects**

We have special projects we work on from time to time. One of them is the Probate Packet Scanning Project, which has been reported on. This is a very long-term project and we will report on the progress each month.

Two other projects we are working on is the Charlotte Library Scanning project and the Rural School project. The rural school project belongs to the Eaton County Historical Commission and we have helped them with this and we will end up with a rich source of information when it is completed.

#### Charlotte Library Scanning Project:

The Charlotte Library Scanning project is underway again and we added new scanned index card files to our website. The next date scheduled to scan at the library is Wednesday, February 25th at the Charlotte Community Library in the Michigan Room. We are scanning the Boyd Preston index card collection and we have more than half of these scanned. The images of these index cards are available on our Charlotte Library page on the website at <u>www.miegs.org/CharlotteLibrary.shtml</u>. The upcoming dates scheduled to scan are Feb 25th, Mar 11th & 25th and Apr 22nd, from 6:30pm to 8:00pm. We will evaluate where we are in April and schedule more sessions if needed to complete the project. When the Boyd Preston collection is completed, we will determine what we scan next, which will most likely be photographs.

#### Eaton County Historical Commission Rural School Project:

We had many items brought in to scan for the school project of the West Windsor school. We will continue to scan materials until further notice, although at some point the information may not be included with the book and/or dvd. Since school information is very valuable for genealogy research, we will always welcome school materials to scan!

The group working on this project has made some decisions on target due dates for the writers to have the stories completed. They would like to have the book published and available for sale about Easter time, which is the first week of April. To give some time for editing and arranging the book, the Commission has requested to have all stories to them by February 10th, 2015.

From the ECGS standpoint, Sherry is working on the data and images that will be included on the DVD, which will be included with the book. The DVD will contain several Name indexes and school and class photo images. A first draft of the DVD will be available for the group by the time this newsletter is published. This will give them a good idea of what the DVD will be, and also give time for suggestions.

### Military Group:

The Military Group held their initial meeting on January 19th, 2015 and 15 people, plus 3 children attended. Bill Haines hosted the meeting by reading and explaining the agenda. A group discussion was then held.

We had several books from our ECGS library to show examples of the types of resources we have available here. We talked about other types of resources we could use, such as on-line information about veterans.

One person who attended explained how his father was one of nine children, and six of them were in World War II at the same time. This is the Cooper family from Grand Ledge. This would be great to have docu-

mented and available for all to see. Another talked about a gun he inherited from his father that, according to stories, was used in World War II. He would like to research this gun and see if he can verify the story.

There were several handouts, one of which was a list of possible things we could work on. There can be multiple sub-projects being worked on by different members of the group. We have set up an email group to provide communication and anyone may request to be added to this group by sending an email to <u>ecgsmilitary@gmail.com</u>. When joining this email group, you will be provided a link to access documents pertaining to this group. The initial handouts are available on the internet now.

We now have a Facebook page called "Eaton County Michigan—Military Special Interest Group". We encourage people to like this page and to post Eaton County military information.

The next meeting will be held on Monday, February 16th, 2015 at 7:00pm at the 1885 Eaton County Courthouse, downtown Charlotte.
