Newspaper Research

I was researching the Fowler name and found these entries in Eaton Co., MI newspapers.

Eaton County Republican - Sat. 17 Jan. 1857

Listed in the Business ads: S. W. Fowler - Attorney - Charlotte.

Eaton County Republican - Sat. 24 Jan. 1857 Note: There were many references in various editions of the paper where he was listed as the attorney in the case.

Eaton County Republican - Sat. 23 July 1859

Died. 21 July. Lena V. Fowler, infant dau. of Jane E. and S. W. Fowler of Charlotte. (Poem included.)

Eaton County Republican - Sat. 30 July 1859

Business ads: S. W. Fowler & C. H. Marsh - Attorneys - Charlotte

The Republican - Thu. 13 Nov. 1862

Died. At Danby, Ionia Co., MI, Alice Fowler, age 12 y, 2 m 3 d, dau. of George B. and Catherine Fowler. (Poem included.)

Eaton County Republican - Fri. 12 Oct. 1860

Died. 19 Oct., Nellie Jane Fowler, only dau. of Jane E. and S. W. Fowler, age 4 yrs., 2 m, 15 d. (Poem included).

Eaton County Republican - Sat. 24 Sept. 1859.

The Michigan Methodist Conference closed 19 Sept. Listed in appointments made to Eaton Co.: Vermontville - Rev. Josiah Fowler.

The Republican - Thu. 17 Sept. 1863.

5. W. Fowler will speak to citizens on national topics, 26 Sept. at the Courthouse.

The Republican - Thu. 8 Oct. 1863

Appointments made at the recent M. E. Conference: Grand Ledge - J. Fowler and J. Roberts.

Newspaper Research, continued



Eaton County Republican - Sat. 30 Oct. 1858

An article concerning Mr. John Q. A. Sessions, a young upcoming lawyer, and S. W. Fowler. Sessions wrote three columns in the Eaton Argus concerning Fowler's role as Prosecuting Attorney.

The Republican - Thu. 17 Dec. 1863.

Listed in the Eaton Co. Cir. Crt. Proceedings: People vs. John Fowler of Eaton Rapids. Morris Belnap is mentioned here also.

The Republican - Thu. 9 Oct. 1862.

Listed among Premiums awarded at the Eaton Co. Fair, held 30 Sept. - 2 Oct. for Pictures and Flowers: Mrs. S. W. Fowler.

The Charlotte Republican - Wed. 6 Nov. 1867.

Included in the list of teachers to whom certificates have been granted during the Fall of 1867. 15 Oct. in Eaton Rapids: Miss Hannah Fowler.

The Charlotte Republican - Thu. 3 Jan. 1867.

Listed in Business ads. J. N. Fowler - Physician & Surgeon.

The Charlotte Republican - Thu. 20 June 1867.

Listed in the ads. J. N. Fowler, Physician, Charlotte, will treat all poor people unable to pay for medical treatment, free every Thursday.

The Charlotte Republican - Thu. 28 Feb. 1867

Married. 22 Feb., at the Robert's Hotel in Charlotte, by Rev. Henry Robinson, Mr. Geo. W. Herring and Miss Sarah L. Fowler, both of Kalamo.

The Republican - Thu. 11 June 1863

Ad. Anyone wishing to join any existing regiment please apply to this Board. R. J. Barry, Pres., H. W. Shank, S. W. Fowler, Enrollment Board, Jackson.
