Vermontville (Pioneer) Cemetery
Vermontville Township, Eaton County, Michigan

Vermontville Cemetery is located west of Vermontville on West Main.

Vermontville is an inactive cemetery and is owned by a private land owner.



Earliest burial on headstone was in 1815. Last burial on headstone was in 1896.

There are many broken stones in this cemetery and various piles of broken stones. In spite of this, we were able to put together most of them enough to identify who they belong to.



It is said that a few headstones were moved from Vermontville cemetery to Woodlawn cemetery after Woodlawn started in 1875 and other family members were buried there. Both the Vermontville cemetery land owner and the Woodlawn Sexton verbally verify this. However, we do not have proof of this. There are 2 sets of stones that we speculate are the people who these may be. These names do not appear on any of the current Vermontville readings.
