

INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the first issue of the "Eaton County Quest". The Eaton County Genealogical Society is very excited about the presentation of this quarterly. We will be striving to make each issue a rewarding adventure in digging into the many untapped sources of the county.

The cover design for our magazine has very special significance. Eaton County is the only county in Michigan, and perhaps in the nation, who has three courthouses still standing. The oldest is the 1845 courthouse which was moved to its present site at Bennett Park (Charlotte) in 1983; next is the courthouse which was built in 1885 and sits on its original site in downtown Charlotte; and the newest is the courthouse which was built in 1979 on the northern edge of Charlotte. The artist for our cover is Debra Milbourn, a Charlotte resident. She generously donated her time to this project and we extend our sincere thanks for a job beautifully done.

Our society was organized in 1988. In these short two years, we have grown from the few founding members to over 100 members. Our group meets at 7 p.m. the third Wednesday of each month (exceptions are- November, the second Wednesday, and December, no meeting), at our room in the Eaton County Historic 1885 Courthouse, 100 W. Lawrence Avenue, Charlotte, MI 48813. The public is welcome to use our facilities every Wednesday from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. Evening appointments can also be arranged. We hope to be able, sometime in the future, to expand our hours and make the room available to you more hours a week. The society holds a genealogical workshop every spring.

Volunteers in our society are able to answer only short and specific research requests by mail as a service. We do have several members who will, for a reasonable fee, do research for those requesting more extensive work. Please include a S.A.S.E with your request.

At present, our archives contain the federal census microfilms for Eaton County, how-to books, county histories, school records, old diaries and journals, family genealogies, photographs, surname index, many original record books from various county offices, the Everton's "Family File" microfiche set, newspaper indexes beginning in 1845, plat books, and much more.

We are always adding to our genealogical and historical material and are working towards a goal of building an outstanding collection, in one central location, where researchers may come to learn more about their early Eaton County ancestors and general history of the area. Those who would like to help build such a place may donate or loan items to the society. Photocopies or transcripts of treasured items would also be welcome, in lieu of an item you do not wish to part with but feel would be helpful to other researchers.

The birth of this quarterly magazine will greatly aid research in Eaton County. The query section will help put many of you in touch with others who may be working on the same family lines. Our society has also just recently released the first in our series of publications on Eaton County cemeteries.

As these new developments help us to grow, so will our library and archives, which in turn will benefit all those interested in early Eaton County history and pioneers. The upcoming year promises to be one of great expansion for us and, we hope, a very rewarding one for you as well.

Housed in the room of the Eaton County Genealogical Society is a book which contains an undated school census for Eaton & Carmel Twps. (comparison with federal census shows it was taken 1870; as usual, ages on school and federal census don't always match), a census of the Eaton Twp. side of Charlotte (taken 27 Aug 1870), and a few marriages solemnized from 1894 to 1900. This book was copied by Joyce Liepins in September 1990.

ADELBERT JAMES HAIGH, AS REMEMBERED BY HIS GRANDSON ROBERT DELBERT HAIGH, FEBRUARY 5, 1990

Adelbert was called "Del" as long as I knew him. He was born March 23, 1864 in Calhoun County, Michigan, the son of Daniel and Hannah Haigh. From there he moved, as a small boy with his parents, to Charlotte, Eaton County, Michigan, then to the Mulliken Road farm where he grew to manhood. He married Lena Mae Uhl on May 20, 1891. Their first child was Myrtle born September 3, 1892, next was Carson born August 3, 1894, then Lyal on October 12, 1896, Beulah on August 8, 1898, and last was Lester April 14, 1900. They lived in Chester Twp. when Myrtle was born, then moved to an 80 acre farm on Benton Rd., Benton Twp., Eaton County, Michigan.

In the early 1900's, Del built a large hip roof barn and put a large addition on the house, along with many other improvements.

Del and Lena purchased the house at 202 E. Henry Street in Charlotte which his mother, Hannah, had previously lived in. They moved the house back to use as a garage and built a new house which still stands today. My parents, Lester and Susie, moved to Del's Benton Twp. farm in the early 1930's.

Grandfather Del would drive out to the farm and help with the work. He did most of the repair work on the equipment, for my father wasn't mechanically minded. He always asked me to help him and I felt proud, thinking that I must be good to be asked. It wasn't until many years later that I realized this was his way of teaching me how to repair things, even though he never mentioned the words teaching or learning while we worked together. I remember how we spliced the hay rope in the barn, and then soaked it in water and rolled it with a plank to size it back to the same diameter as the rest of the rope so it would pass through the car that ran on the track at the top of the barn.

We would repair all the equipment for this was in the depression years and there was no money to buy new. He owned forty acres about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles east of the 80 acres where he cut logs and had them sawed to keep a supply of boards on hand. They were piled with slats between each layer to let air through so they would be dry when we needed them.

We had a large orchard but the trees had been let go too long and the apples were not of much use. I asked Granddad how to trim them and he told me to cut off the branches until I thought I had gone far enough, and then turn around and cut off the same amount again. I took some of the trees I liked the apples best and started cutting off limbs. I cut until I was sure I had cut off plenty of limbs, but Granddad had always been right, so I cut the same amount off again even though I knew I had ruined the trees. Granddad was right again, for the next year we had the best apples I had ever seen.

One story I remember is of his going north with a horse and buggy, trading it for forty acres of timber, expecting to move up there and go into the lumber business, but Grandma refused. I never knew where it was or what happened to it.

Another story told was of him cleaning a gun, in the kitchen of the house on Mulliken Rd. which his folks owned. The gun went off and put a hole through the ceiling.

He was a typical Englishman, with his mustache and his stern manner. He ate with a knife, peas and all, much to the delight of us kids although we knew better than to laugh or make fun of it.

His biggest gift to me was the fact you never said it couldn't be done. Instead, you looked it over and went ahead and fixed it. This helped me through the years of different jobs I had, for when others said it couldn't be done, I didn't know what those words meant, so I did it anyway.

Î will never forget the sad day in December 1937 when I was 13 years old and stood looking at grandfather Haigh lying in his beautiful wood casket in the house he built at 202 E. Henry St., Charlotte. I

knew an era had come to an end.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE ELIJAH BOTTOMLEY FAMILY

Elijah Bottomley was born in Lancashire, England, December 18, 1814. Mary Shaw was born at Yorkshire, England, October 25, 1817. Elijah and Mary were married at Huddersfield, England in 1837. After marriage they settled for a time in Paddock, England where their two eldest children were born- John on February 18, 1838 and James Henry on March 27, 1841.

In March 1842/43 they left their mother country and crossed the broad Atlantic, seeking a home and a fortune in the wilds of Michigan, settling in Chester Twp., Eaton County, in May 1842. On November 19, 1843 Hannah Elizabeth Bottomley was born, being one of the first white children born in Chester township.

August 21, 1845, Isaac William Bottomley was born. In 1846, Elijah bought sixty acres of Robert Grant for twenty shillings an acre, fell the trees and built a log cabin on one corner and moved the family in without floor or windows. This is where Charles W. Bottomley was born, July 31, 1847.

The trials, privations, and hardships which they had to endure cannot be described, but through all, a father's skillful labor, and a mother's care, labor and love kept the wolf from the door. The little ones came faster than the money, and oftimes they were sorely puzzled to know how to feed and clothe them.

April 1849 Eliza Jane was born; May 4, 1851 Emily S. was born; February 13, 1854 Levi W. was born; May 21, 1856 Mary Alice was born and she died in 1857. Fredric E. was born 14 September 1857. Ellen Bottomley was born 14 August 1860 and died in 1861.

Hannah E. Bottomley married Daniel Haigh on June 1, 1863. (See the biography of Adelbert James Haigh, son of Daniel and Hannah Bottomley Haigh, on page 43 & 44.)

John and James Bottomley enlisted in Co. H, Michigan Infantry, on September 11, 1862. John died while in the service. In March 1864, James reenlisted. He was honorably discharged in 1865. Isaac enlisted in the same regiment, for four years.

In 1864, Elijah Bottomley engaged in mercantile business with Charles Shaw, at Jordan's Corners (1 mile south of Gresham). He sold his homestead in 1867 and continued in the business. In 1868, he traded his store with Frank Pierce for forty acres in Chester Twp.

The 1860's were the most memorable period in the history of the family. Three sons answered their country's call and took up arms in defense, John giving his life. Ellen, the 11th child, died. Five defense, John giving his life. Dilon, children were married, Hannah, James, Eliza, Isaac, and Emily, and four besides many other events. children were born, besides man, the period of the 1870's contained two deaths, two marriages, and

the birth of fifteen grandchildren.

On July 12, 1881, the sainted wife and mother was called to her reward, at age 64 years.
