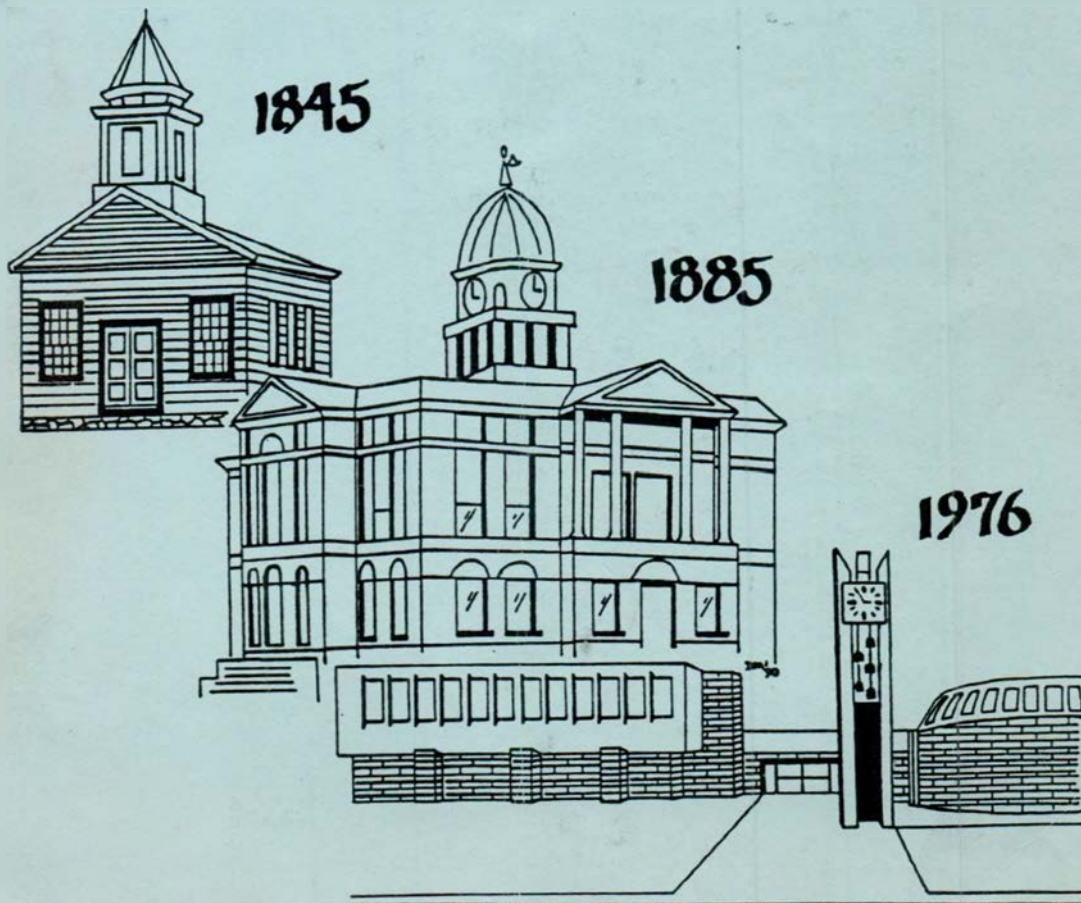

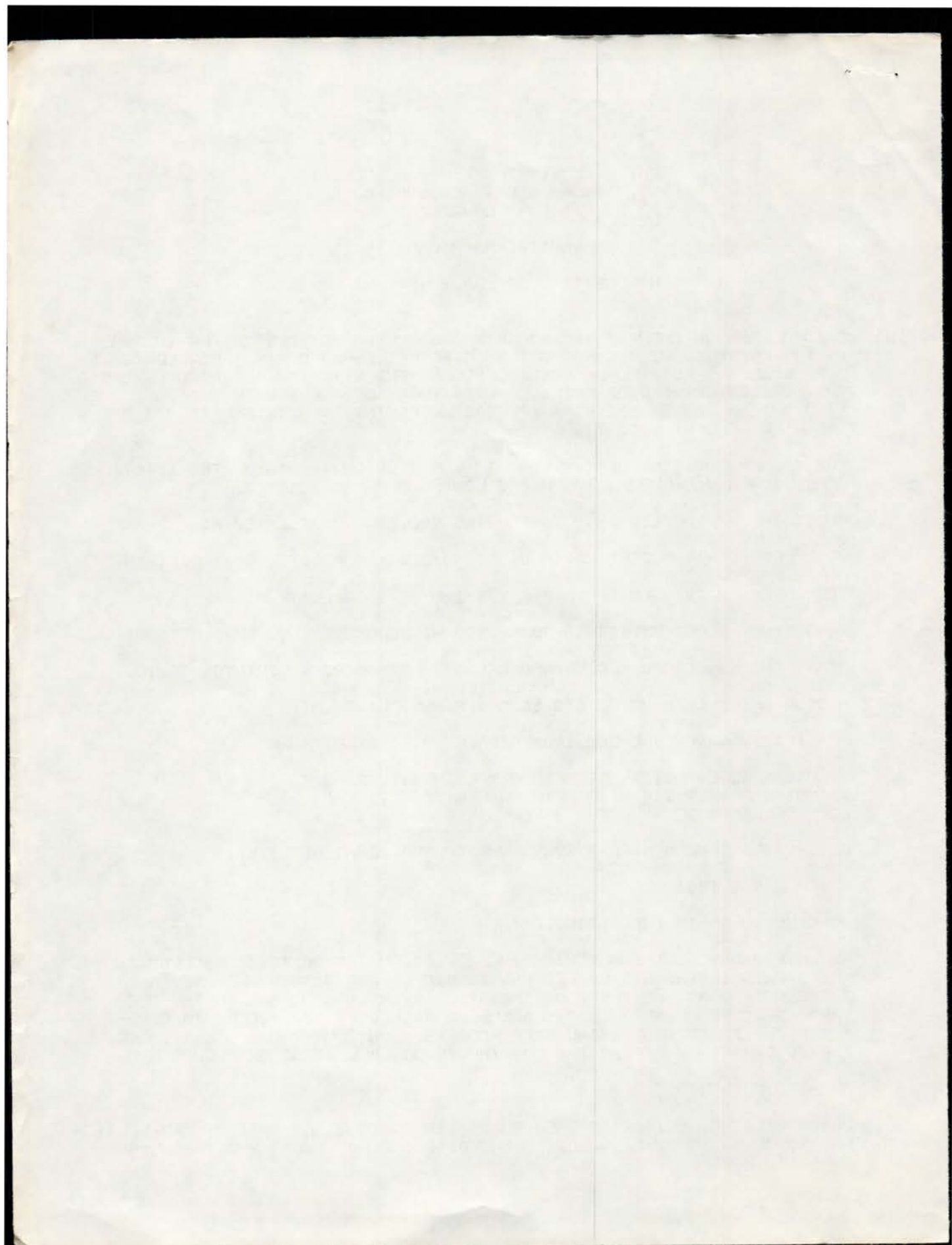

REMARKS:

BENTON: In the township of Benton, during the months of July, August and September, there raged an epidemic of dysentery which was predominant and baffled the skill of physicians, as appears from the above schedule.

EATON: The dysentery epidemic prevailed here also and considerable deaths occurred. Smallpox also raged in the town during the months of February and March but was principally confined to two families and no deaths occurred from the disease.

Postage Increases:
