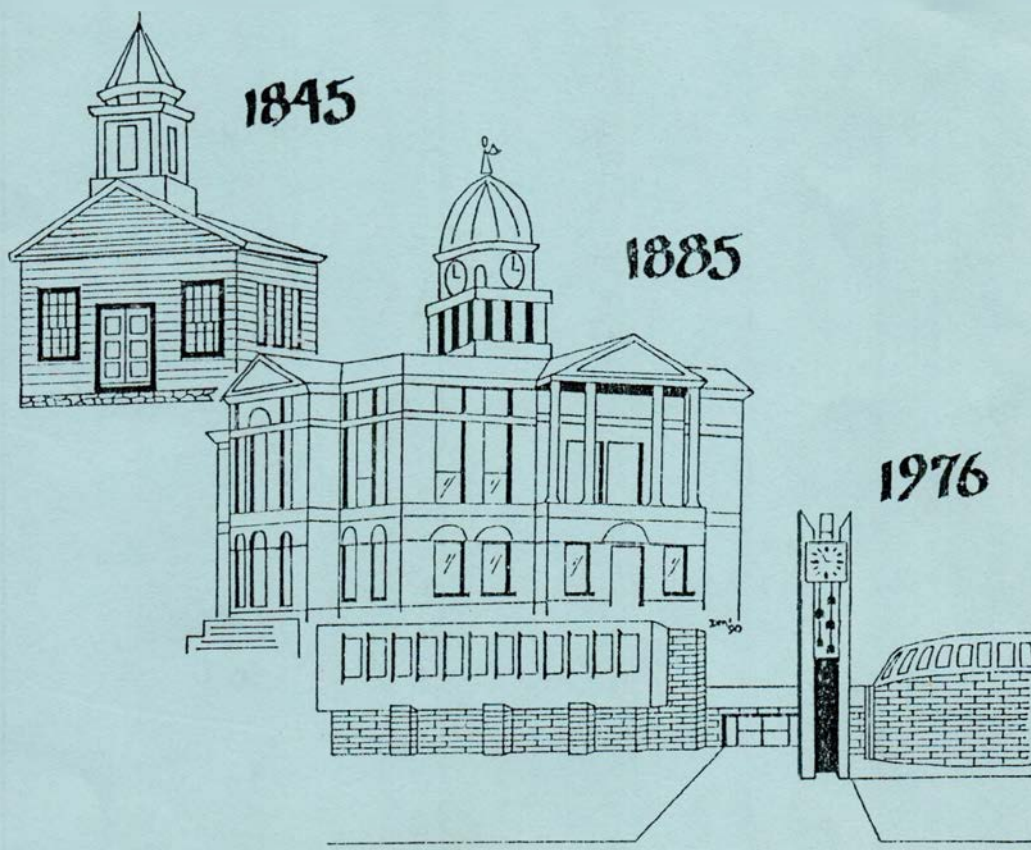

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At a meeting of the Board of Supervisors for the County of Eaton on the first monday of July AD 1842. Here present Andrew W. Rogers, Alonzo Baker, A. D. Shaw, Flavel Stone, John Dow, Hiran Bowen, James M. Collins, George Y. Cowan, E. H. Barbour by proxeey, S. S. Hoyt, Jesse Hart. The board organized and John Dow being appointed chairman of the board proceeded to business.

On a motion of J. M. Collins, resolved that David Barbour be entitled to sit as a member of this board in the place of E. H. Barbour.

July 4th, Eraster S. Ingersol Supervisor of Delta present.
Also John D. Skinner of Windsor.

Resolved that Osmyn Childs be and he is hereby allowed three and 50/100 Dollars for Ruthlands Surrogate, (book of forms) which said book is to be kept in and for the use of the probate office of this county.

Tuesday 5th, Truman W. Nichols, present.

Wednesday 6th, Resolved That W. S. Fairfield be and he is hereby allowed the sum of one hundred Dollars in full for his services in taking charge of and boarding John Miller a prisner up to June the 20th, 1842.

Resolved that the clerk be and he is hereby authorized and required to purchase for the county a sufficent quantity of

blank assessment rolls to make out a copy of the assessment rolls for the year 1842.

Resolved that the treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay out of the county funds in his hands, all such taxes and charges upon lands which shall appear by legal testimony presented to him to have been illegally assessed upon such lands for the year 1838.

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Resolved that whenever Legal and satisfactory Evidence shall

be presented to the treasurer, showing that the taxes, on any piece or parcel of land assessed and returned for the year 1838 is illegal said treasurer shall defer the sale of said land until he can send said evidence or a certified copy. Thereof to the Auditor General for inspection and that in case such testemoney shall not be satisfactory to the Auditor General to indemnify and save harmless said treasurer from all costs and charges which he may or shall be put to in consequence of said act.

And it is further resolved that the resolution here to fore made requiring the treasurer to pay said taxes be and the same is hereby reconcedind and recinded.

Resolved that John Dow be and he is hereby authorized and required to purchase at the Land office at Ionia, a plat of this county, for the use of said county of such description as the one which E. Follett was autherized to purchase last year. Provided the same can be purchased with a delinquent tax bond of \$50 which the treasurer is hereby authorized to deliver to said Dow for such purpose.

Resolved that the clerk be and he is hereby authorized to draw orders on the treasurer of the county for all sums allowed during the sessions of this board with interest.

Resolved that all county orders now outstanding shall draw interest on the amount due from and after this date.

Resolved that Martin Andrew be allowed seventy-five cents and a piece for twelve benches for the court room to be made by next court.

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Resolved, that M. S. Brackett be and he is hereby authorized to purchase a suitable sheet iron door for safe in the clerks office and to have said office finished on the inside.

Resolved, that F. F. White be and he is hereby authorized to procure the Registers books covered as he shall deem proper.

Resolve that the affidavit and certificate of Walter A. Munroe relative to killing a wolf be allowed.
Adjourned to meet again Tuesday Morning at 8 o'clock AM.

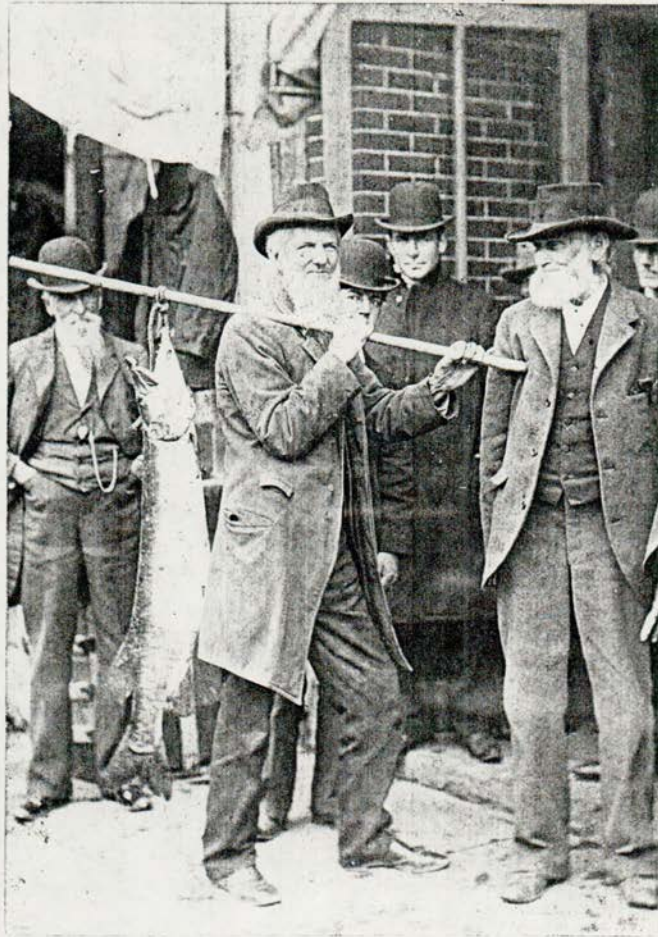

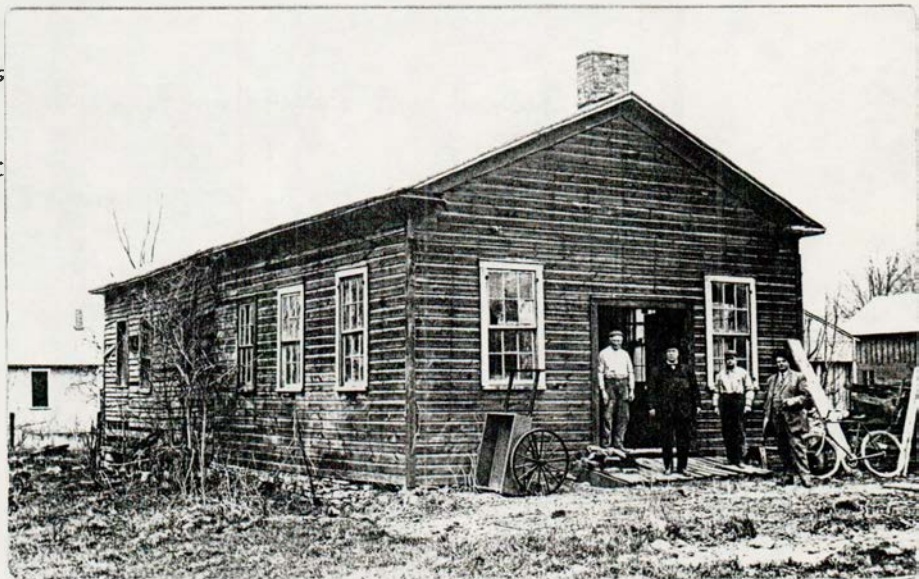

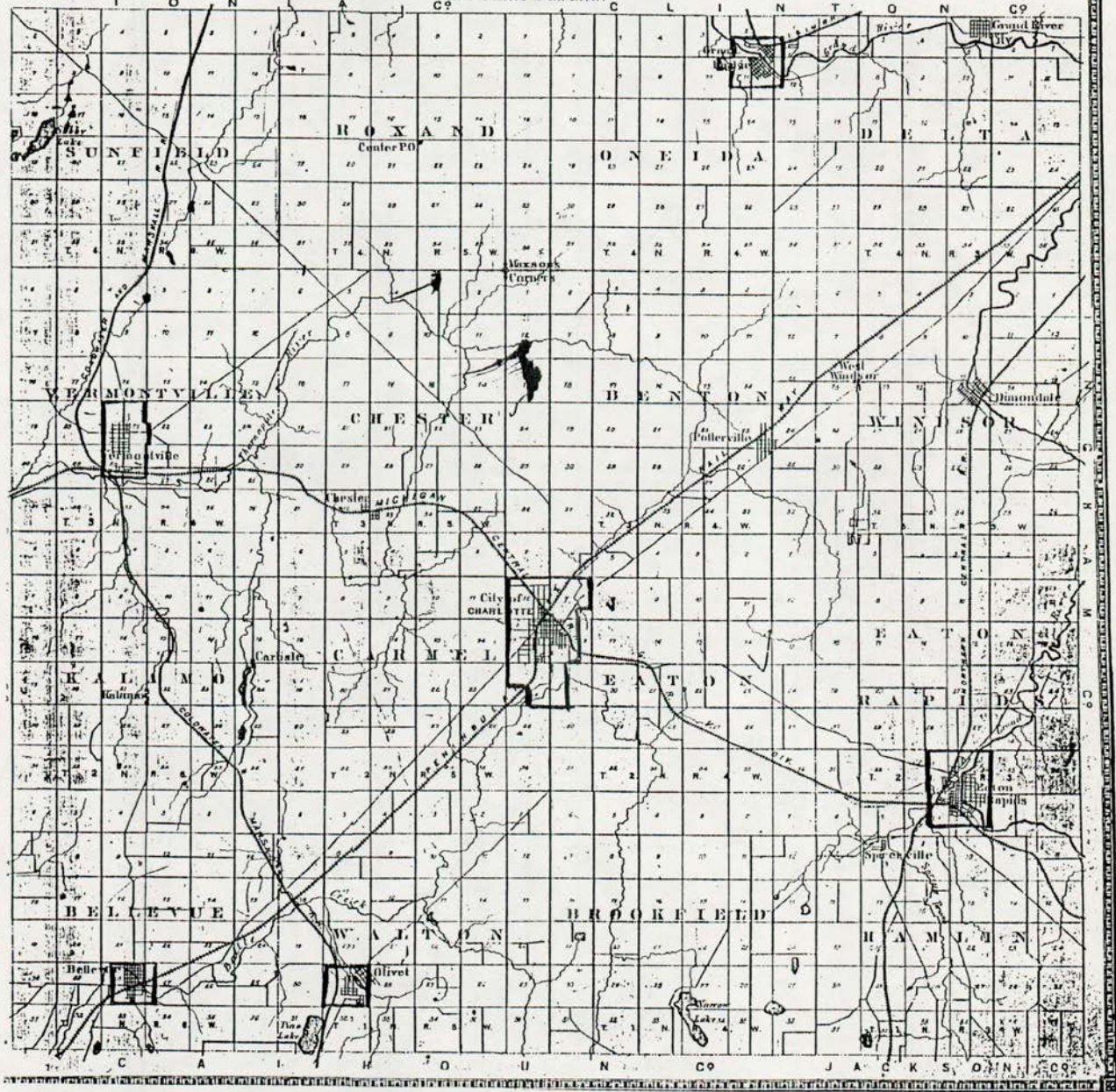
