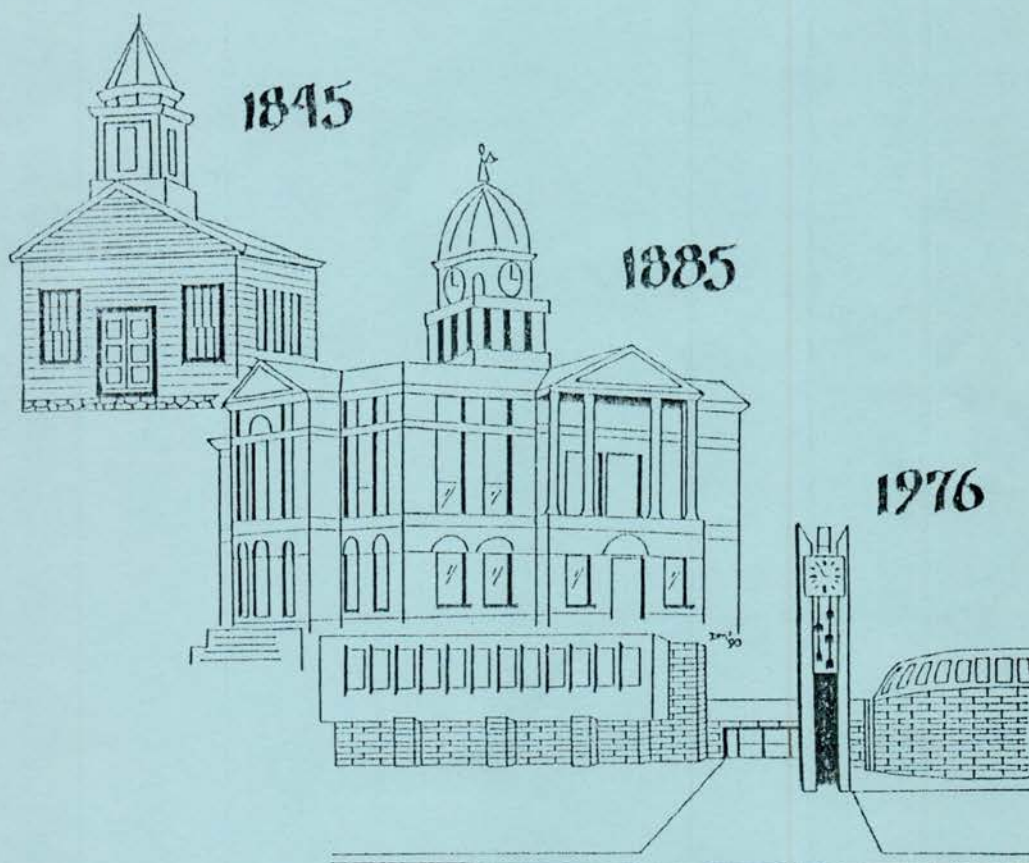

#### **A Potterville Mystery**

**Remains of An Unknown Man Found Near That Place**

**Perry Gregg**, who resides two miles north of Potterville, while digging in a gravel pit on **John Wright's** farm, on the Grand Ledge road, last Tuesday unearthed the remains of a man in a badly decomposed state. All that remains of what was once a human being, and his last resting place, a rude box, lay about four feet deep in the pit, and had every appearance that a load of stone had been dumped around and on top of the box at the time of burial.

A difference of opinion exists in regard to the length of time that the body had remained in its queer resting place (by the roadside), and the only clue that has a tendency to clear up the mystery is a legend handed down in **Mr. Wright's** family by **Mr. W.'s** father who related to his children in by-gone days of an Englishman who became owner of a large tract of government land for services rendered in the war of 1812, and had workmen clearing this land, coming here occasionally from the east (his home) to see how the work progressed.

It was on one of these visits that the land owner disappeared, and no trace of him could ever be found, and his relatives could only surmise that he had been foully dealt with. The conception is a shrouded affair and no doubt will never be brought to light. --Potterville Press.

**FATE OF THE 1885  
HISTORIC  
COURTHOUSE**

For those of you who have been watching the status of the 1885 Historic Courthouse, the final word will be out in June as to whether it has a chance for survival. A feasibility study is currently taking place. The Eaton County Historical Commission has received approval from the Eaton County Board of Commissioners for funding, not to exceed \$7,000, for a feasibility study. The study is to be completed by June 1. This study will determine, through community feedback, whether or not there is enough financial support for the restoration of the building. If so, a public charitable organization will be established for that purpose, and they, or the Historical Commission, will lease the property from the county for \$1 a year for 99 years. This organization would solicit corporate and individual contributions and investigate grants and public funds for the restoration and operation of a museum/community center complex. If not enough interest and/or backing is found during the feasibility study, the county is free to explore other options concerning the courthouse square property. This study and proposal includes the 1871 sheriff's residence as well as the 1885 Historic Courthouse.
