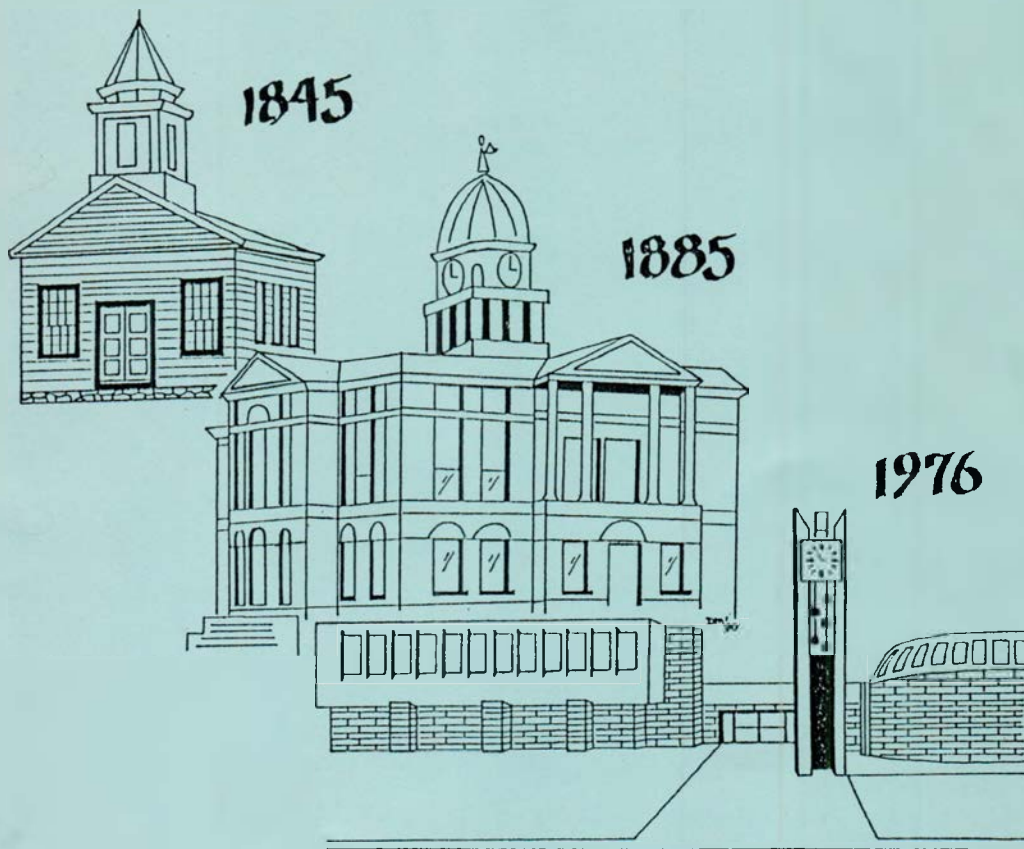

"Remembers Great-Grandmother Born Before Revolutionary War"

(Copied, 28 Mar 1993 by Joyce Liepins, from "The Sunfield Sentinel", Thursday, January 3, 1929)

America, after all, is comparatively a young nation, when we take into consideration that we have a Sunfield man who remembers well his great-grandmother who was born before the Revolutionary war. Our local citizen is **G.W. Meyers** who still works at his trade of harness and shoe repairing although past 83 years of age.

Mr. Meyers was born in Crawford county, Ohio, September 30, 1845, where he lived until about four years of age. Now **Mr. Meyers**, who has lived beyond the three score years and ten allotted to man, says he remembers well some of the incidents that occurred during the last year he lived in the county of his birth, despite the fact that he was so young. One of the incidents was going to a log barn to gather ducks' eggs with his great-grandmother who was then about 80 years of age. **Mr. Meyers** being past 83 at present and his great-grandmother about 80 at the time he remembers her, would bring her birth before the war that gave America her independence.

Mr. Meyers' parents, Mr. and Mrs. Z.B. Meyers', moved to Michigan when he was about four years old. They resided at Charlotte about two months and then went to Odessa township where they stayed with **Mr. and Mrs. George Richmond** while a small house was built for them in Woodland township. The family moved into the new house in February though it had neither doors or windows.

Mr. Meyers was married in Woodland township when 24 years old and resided there until 1889, then came to Sebewa township, living about a mile north and west of Sunfield.

After residing in Sebewa several years, he decided to change his occupation of farming and took up the harness maker's trade, a trade he had worked at some while residing in Woodland. After working under several competent men in Sunfield for some time, **Mr. Meyers** went into business for himself, making and repairing harnesses and later took up shoe repairing in connection. He has now been engaged in this line of work about 30 years, nearly all the time in Sunfield.

Mr. Meyers' shop is now located just a few feet from his house which is near the Sunfield school house. Here you may find him every week day pegging shoes or mending a harness, and says he feels good doing it.

So far as **Mr. Meyers** knows, only two of his schoolmates are still alive-- his brother, **Wesley Meyers**, and a girl chum.

- TRIVIA TAKEN FROM "THE SUNFIELD SENTINEL", DECEMBER 10, 1908 -

** A short time since while plowing, **John McCartney** of West Kalamo, unearthed what is proving to be quite a valuable relic. It is the petrified foot of an Indian child on which is plainly traced the moccasin that it wore. On close examination the bone and flesh is plainly decernable and from the marks left, experts say that the foot was cut off either by a knife or some other sharp implement used by the Indians. **Mr. McCartney** sent the relic to Ann Arbor where it has been examined by experts who state positively that it is a petrified foot and that it has been amputated. The figure embroidered on the moccasin can readily be traced and take it all together it makes quite a relic. Collectors who saw it in Ann Arbor offered \$20 for it but the offer was refused.---"Vermontville Echo."

** While digging a grave in the Dimondale cemetery a few days ago, **Ben Hatfield**, the sexton, had a peculiar accident happen to him. He had just finished the grave and was scraping the bottom when one side caved in, and as he had been expecting it he was ready to jump. As the dirt gave away **Hatfield** threw his shovel and made a spring but was caught and buried almost to his hips and he could not get out.

The sexton has a large bull dog which was with him and as there was no one within hearing distance he threw a small handful of dirt at the shovel which was six feet away and told the dog to "fetch it." By repeating this time after time he finally succeeded in getting the dog to worry the shovel within reach, then he dug himself out.---"Grand Ledge Times"

** Little **Willie Winters**, a pupil in one of the grade schools in a neighboring city, dropped a marble on the floor and the reprimand he received and the outcome of his punishment will be placed on exhibition at the next teachers' meeting.

The teacher sent **Willie** to the superintendent to be searched. She found 167 articles in his pockets, as follows: One rooster's spur , one knife, forty-two small nails, six matches, five cigarette papers, three safety pins, one amber pipe stem, fifty-seven marbles, one penny, seven buttons, three poker chips, eleven metal tops from beer bottles, one piece colored glass, one corkscrew, thirty-two filberts, three English walnuts, one whistle, one piece red cord, and several score of BB shot for use in an air gun.--"Grand Ledge Independent"

At Sunfield, Mich., was gathered the family of **Gilberts** for a three day good time, Sept. 11th, 12th and 13th. It was the first special gathering in thirty years. And words cannot express the heart-felt appreciation of the entire gathering.

Those of the family present were respectfully: **Eli P. Gilbert** of Buchanan, Mich., who is a farmer in Berrien county; **Wm. Gilbert** at whose place the gathering took place; **D.W. Gilbert** of Superior, Wis., who is in the employment of the U.S. Government at the federal building in his city; **U.G. Gilbert** resides at Marquette, Mich., is a garment dyer and cleaner by trade and in charge of the Needham Bros. & Williams in his city; **Mrs. Ina (Gilbert) Bates** is from Wichita, Kan., whose husband is engaged usually in real estate but who joined the rest of the family in the gala time and is also looking to shipping fruit and vegetables from Michigan south; **Elza Gilbert** who has made his home with his brother **U.G.** for some time past but is putting in the summer in Michigan visiting.

Since the last meeting each has encountered many interesting instances which help to add pleasure to many stories told.

The one thing regretted by all was the absence of three boys of the family residing near Chippewa Falls and Eau Claire, Wis., who could not arrange to come at this time. Those absent are respectfully: **Geo. Gilbert** who works at common labor, **Orlo Gilbert** a farmer, and **Eber Gilbert** a liveryman.

At one special gathering at dinner the party voted to meet at the residence of the bro. **U.G.** in August, 1910 at which time we hope to have the rest of the family present.

The family of **Wm. H.** and part of the family of **Mrs. Bates** joined in the good things of the reunion. The last day was spent in visiting with an only uncle who resides at Sheridan, Mich., after which the party returned to their several homes all feeling better for the good times. (Signed) One of the brothers.

Walsh Family- Taken from the 27 August 1908 issue:

Aug. 4, being the 74th birthday of **William Walsh** and the 1st birthday of his 10th great grandchild, **Helen Mary Benedict**, a double celebration took place Aug. 19 at the old Walsh farm a few miles north of Vermontville. This event was looked forward to and carefully planned by the children. Nothing was wanting to make the occasion a memorable one. After the twenty-one people had partaken of a bountiful spread, the afternoon festivities began with a speech by **William Walsh** to his family, followed by an original poem by his daughter, **Mary**. Then followed music by different members present, including Irish and French songs by **Mr. Walsh**. A pleasant feature of the afternoon was the starting of a birthday fund for **Helen Mary**, to which \$25 was contributed. Pictures were taken of the four generations in two different families and of the entire company. In the evening fireworks and a Christmas tree was provided for the younger members, **Mary Walsh** acting as Mrs. Santa Claus. It was decided to make this an annual event.

Halladay Family- Taken from the 25 August 1910 issue:

Aug. (17?) occurred the annual Halladay reunion. About 80 gathered at the old Ingall's ford of Grand river and partook of a bountiful dinner. The time was spent in greeting new friends and renewing old friendship.

| 2 cups coarsely chopped nut meats | 1 teaspoon baking powder |
| 1 1/2 cups sugar                  | 3 eggs                   |
| 3/4 cup flour                     | 1/2 teaspoon salt        |

Beat the eggs well, add the sugar, nuts, flour, salt and baking powder, the last three sifted together. Spread as thinly as possibly. When nearly cold cut into squares.

Beat the butter and sugar to a cream, add the egg and milk beaten together with the vanilla. Lastly stir in your flour with which the salt and baking powder has been sifted. Drop in spoonfuls on a greased pan leaving room for mixture to spread. Bake quickly and while still warm roll into cornucopias or any form desired.

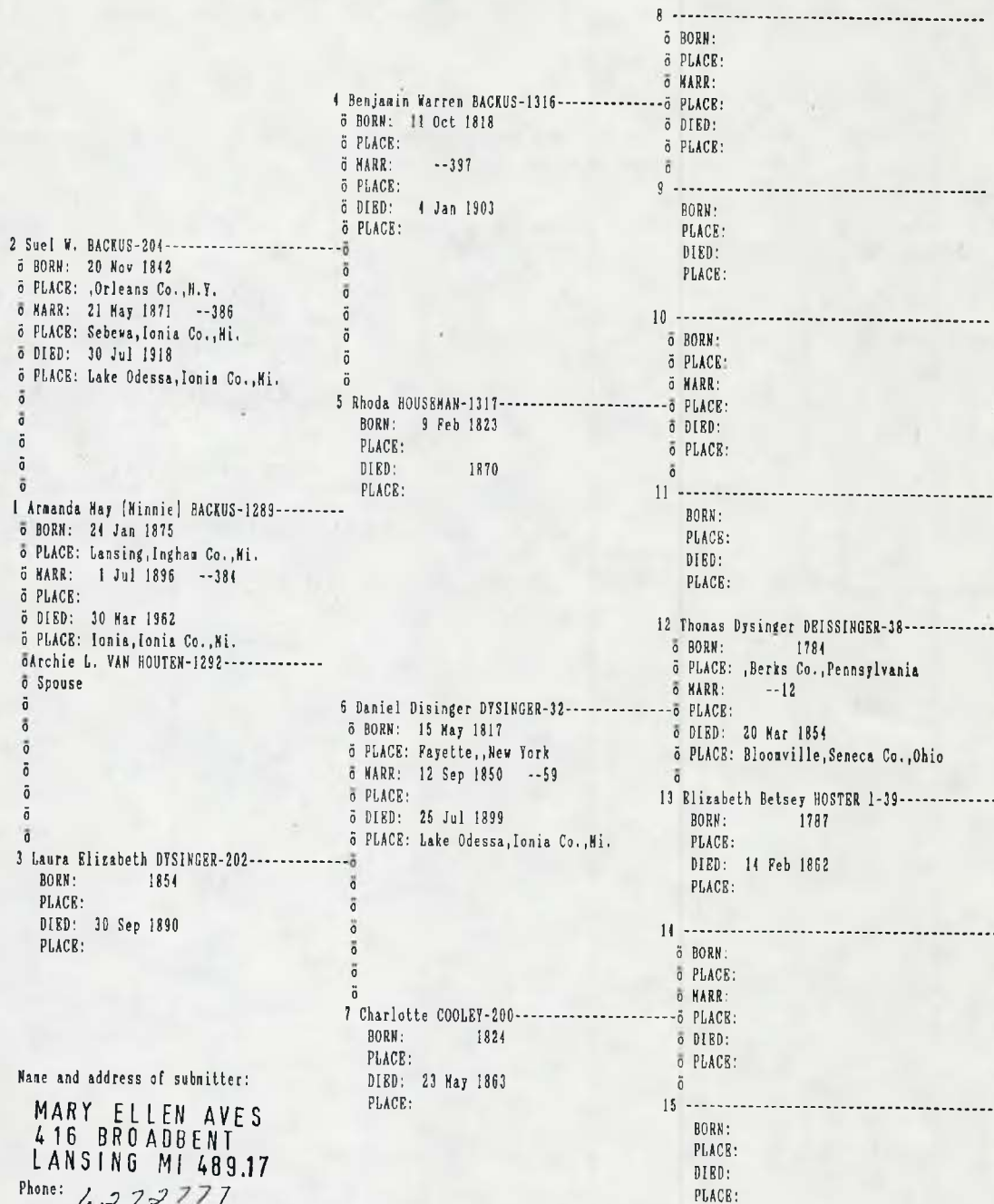
