Minnie F. Farmer, Church Book 1891. Continued from Issue #31 By M.J. Baker.

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June 7, 1891

The communion services were held at the usual hour and 90 partook of the Lord and supper. CLARK GREEN & WIFE, LILLIE & GRACIE GREEN, MARY DAYTON, FANNIE LAPHAM, MR. FAY & WIFE received the hand of fellowship.

June 24, 1891

Rog. covenant meeting opened with singing hymn 57 and the scripture being read from John 7 Chap. After singing hymn 268, Deacon GREEN led in prayer and 65 joined in giving testimony to the love of Christ, and their redemption through its power. After reading the covenant and prayer the meeting adjourned.

July 5, 1891

The regular communion services were held and 73 partook of the emblems of the broken body and shed blood of Christ. Rev. A.H. JESSUP of Wooster, Ohio was present and assisted the pastor in the ordinance.

Aug. 1, 1891

Reg. Covenant meeting was held, after the opening exercises led by our pastor. 50 gave testimony of their love to Christ and his cause. The following letters were granted on condition that the treasurer reported them clear of all indebtedness to church support, etc. OLIVE CAPEL to unite with the Alma Church. JOHN VANDERBECK to unite with the Dimondale Church and SILAS GODFREY & wife to unite with the Marshall Church. After reading the covenant and prayer by the pastor, the meeting adjourned.

August 3, 1891

Regular communion services were held and 69 partook of the Lord's supper.

August 4, 1891

Sister SUSAN STEVENS passed to the home above. She had been a great sufferer but amid all patient and unrepining. Memorial services were held in the church on Sunday, Aug. 2, 1891. When a memorial address was delivered by our pastor touching on the unassuming Christian life which had passed away from us, the last received the first crowned. Red and approved. Sept. 5/91.

Regular covenant meeting of Sept. 6/91 was opened by the reading of the scripture from Luke 23 Chapter by the pastor, who also led in prayer. Hymns 165 & 40 were sung;.

Minutes of the previous meetings read and approved. After singing, letters were granted to the following: D.C. TOMPKINS and wife, L.B. TOMPKINS & wife and EUGENE TOMPKINS, to unite with the Spottsylvania Baptist Church, Virginia. MRS. OLIVE CAPELL to unit with the Alma Baptist Church & JOHN VANDERBECK to unite with the Dimondale Baptist Church. After singing, all present joined in the exercises of the hour and realized the presence of the Master. After remarks by the pastor and the reading of the covenant, the meeting adjourned. Red & approved Oct. 3/91.

On Sept. 7, 1891, Brother L. (or T) W. DANIELS passed to his reward after a protracted sickness of nearly one year. The funeral services were held at the house on Thursday, Sept. 10, the pastor officiating. Read & approved Oct. 3/91.

The annual meeting of the church was held in the session room of the church Tuesday evening Sept. 29, 1891. The pastor read the 3 chapters of Acts. After singing hymn 51, Deacon GREEN led in prayer.

The minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved. The treasurer H.M.G. read his report which showed the arrearages of last year paid up and an advance all along the line of about 50% and on action the report was adopted and ordered spread on the records. The pastor read the receipts & disbursements of the building fund. CLARENCE SPRINGER and E.F. KNAPP were appointed tellers. The following officers were unanimous elected by ballots. Deacon, WM. P. GREEN, Trustees, E.F. KNAPP & C.I. BARRETT, Clerk, M.E. FARMER, Treasurer, H.M. GRIFFIN, Bible School Superintendent, JAMES RUSSELL. Deacon GREEN read the report of the poor fund which was adopted and ordered spread on the records.

The pastor & Deacon GREEN were appointed a committee to wait on Brother RUSSELL & report the action of the church in regard to his election.

The time having arrived for the Sunday School meeting, the meeting of the church adjourned. Read & approved, Oct. 3/91.

Covenant meeting. The regular covenant meeting Sat. Oct. 3, 1891 was opened by the 24 Chapter of Matt being read as the scripture lesson and the pastor leading in prayer. After singing No. 60, the regular exercises began. 40 gave in their testimony on the Lord's side. Minutes of previous meetings read and approved. Moved and carried ;to hold the communion service at the close of the morning sermon the first Sunday in each month. The covenant was read and prayer offered after which the meeting adjourned.

Communion services was held after the morning sermon Sunday, Oct. 4/91. 84 partook of the emblems. Read & approved at Reg. cov. meeting Sat. Oct. 31/91.

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The regular covenant meeting was held Sat. Oct. 31/91 and was opened by singing No. 29. The pastor read the 8 Chapter of Hebrews as the days lesson and led in pr,ayer. Sang No. 72. Minutes of previous meetings read & approved. Sang Nos. 60 & 220. The regular exercise began and 20 gave in their testimony on the Lord's side. ELTA OR ELLA GOODYEAR was received into fellowship from the Cascade Baptist Church. MISS LUCINDA PRESCOTT from Jackson Baptist Church, MR. HENRY HUSTED & MINNIE JOHNSON were received as candidates for baptism. The church voted to use the \$30. given to Home Mission towards making Deacon GREEN a life member of that society. Moved and supported to postpone the communion till the 1st Sunday of December. Covenant was read and we were led in prayer by the pastor. After which the meeting was adjourned.

Thursday evening, Nov. 20/91. Letters were granted to MR & MRS. FRED C. COBB to unite with the Charlotte Baptist Church. Also, to MISS SARAH YOUNG nee PERRY to unite with the Mason Baptist Church.

Union Thanksgiving services were held in the church November 26/91. Sermon by L. DELAMATER of M.E. Church.

Friday, Nov. 27/91, the funeral services of Brother SAM UNDERWOOD was held in the church, he having been suddenly killed on the night of Nov. 24/91. It was a very impressive service. At the close of which pastor announced the death of Brother C.P. FESSENDEN which occurred early in the morning of that 27 day. His funeral services were held in the church Sunday morning, Nov. 29/91. Addresses being given by Brothers FIELD & STEVENSON followed by a sermon by pastor.

Reg. Covenant meeting on Sat. Dec. 5/91 was opened by the reading of the scripture and prayer by the pastor. About 50 uniting in covenant & testimony. Death having so recently visited us seemed to inspire a general feeling of consecration. The presence of the Master was manifest.

On Sunday, Dec. 6/91, the regular communion service was held and 116 partook of the emblems. Read & approved.

Reg. Cov. meeting opened on Saturday, Jan. 2/92 by singing No. 162. The 4 Chap of Ephen (?) was read by MABLE FIELD as the scripture lesson. The pastor led in prayer. Sang No. 54. The minutes of past meetings read and approved. Sang no. 163. The pastor made a few remarks and after singing another stanza of 163, the regular exercises began and 32 gave in their testimony on the Redeemers side. After a season of silent prayer, Deacon GREEN led in prayer, after singing Praise God, we were dismissed with the benediction.

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Feb. 6, 1892.

Extra meetings have been held commencing Jan.3rd and continuing until now with increasing interest. About thirty have professed to find Christ or asked the prayers of the church in their behalf, of whom eighteen have been received as candidates for baptism. Sister HUSTED and Brother & Sister UNDERWOOD have been received from other churches on their Christian experiences, they having been baptized and Sister FLORA C. HOLLIDAY was received on her letter from the First Baptist Church, Norwalk, Ohio.

On Sunday evening, Jan. 24/92 (1892), after a sermon on "Sights and Sounds of Life", our pastor baptized MARY E. HUDSON, and MATTIE BAKER who had found Christ. Let us hope and ;pray that the good begun may abound more and more unto the salvation of many.

Read & Approved.

Feb. 6, 1892

The regular convenant meeting opened by singing No. 59, after which part of the Chapter of St. John was read, as the scripture lesson. We were led in prayer by the pastor. Sang one stanza of No.60. Minutes of previous meetings were read & approved. 2nd Stanza of 60 sung. On motion, MRS. C.H. WALLACE, nee BELL PORTER, be restored and granted a letter to unite with the Baptist Church at Hamond, Ind. Sang last stanza of No. 60 and the regular exercises were taken up. 59 giving in their testimony on the Lord's side. Our pastor led in prayer and then made a few remarks, urging especially S.S. [Sunday School] teachers to work among their scholars. After reading the covenant we were dismissed with the benediction. Read and approved.

Special meetings were continued until the last week of Feb. During which time the following were received as candidates for baptism.

Feb. 1892: MR & MRS SPERRY WISE, MRS. ANNA BLY, and ELSIE MACK.

Feb. 3, 92: WM. H. BLY, CLIFFORD BEMAN, SCOTT SPEARS, CHAS. BLAKESLEY, CHAS & LUELLA MERRITT.

Feb. 5, 92: ABBIE & CHAS. HOLCOMB, MRS. MYRTELLE SHUCK and MR. BLAKESLEY.

Feb. 14, 92: MINNIE WING & MRS. OTTO.

Feb. 19, 92: MRS. PHEOBE REYNOLDS, SOLOM GALLOWAY & JERRY MILLER.

On Sunday eve, Feb. 7, after a sermon by the pastor the following followed our Master in the ordinance of baptism: MR. SPERRY WISE, MRS. MELSINE WISE, CLIFFORD BEMAN, SCOTT SPEARS, GEO. & LUELLA MERRITT, MRS. SCHUCK, ABBIE & CHAS. HOLCOMB.

On Sunday eve., Feb. 14, 92 WM. H. & MRS. ANNA BLY, ELSIE MACK, MINNIE WIND & MRS. OLIVIA OTTO were baptized.

On Sun. eve. Feb. 21/92: MRS. PHEOBE REYNOLDS & SOLON GALLOWAY entered the baptismal waters.

March 5, 92: The regular covenant meeting was held at which time the following were received as candidates for baptism: MRS. GEO. W. CADY, HATTIE HOYT & HULDA STONE. A special Business meeting was ordered for Mr. 31/92.

March 6, 1892, the communion was held and the hand of fellowship was extended to twenty two (22). At the evening service of the same day (Mar. 6), MRS. GEO. M. CADY, HATTIE HOYT & JERRY MILLER were baptized.

Mar. 17/92: After the prayer meeting JENNIE HOYT was received as a candidate for baptism. During the services Thursday eve., Mar. 24 HULDA STONE & JENNIE HOYT entered the baptismal waters.

On Thursday, March 31, 1892 a special meeting was held during the afternoon and evening, taking the place of the regular covenant meeting. The meeting was opened by singing number 130, after which Brother BRODI led in prayer and hymn 360 was sung. Deacon PARKER then led in prayer and all joined in singing two stanzas of No. 138. After a few remarks by the pastor the last stanza of the same hymn was sung and a devotional meeting was held for a time very profitably. After the devotional exercises were through, the reason for which the meeting was held was stated by the pastor, which was to consider what should be done to raise the amount necessary to pay for the lot, purchased for sheds, for which no provision had ever been made. It was stated by the pastor that if all paid their subscriptions there would be nearly enough to cover the indebtedness on the church building fund which did not include either the lot or the balance due on the organ. After some remarks had been made by brethren present, the pastor suggested that as some had said that they preferred the small organ to the pipe organ, that if such an opinion prevailed generally, it would be better to take out the organ and with the amount which it would bring to the church the lot could be paid for and all the indebtedness cancelled. After a free and full discussion, in which everyone who spoke advocated strongly the keeping of the organ and pledging their willingness to assist in paying the balance due upon it, the following motion was offered and passed unanimously. The pastor requested everyone to vote for or against, that the full voice of the church might be known. "That we keep the organ and each do our part toward paying the balance upon it when called upon for that purpose".

At this point of the meeting Brother ISAIAH CORBIN brought up the question of salary & urged that it might be made large enough to make it satisfactory to the pastor. Deacon GREEN stated he knew churches had been trying to get the pastor away and that he knew he could get a much larger salary than here, but thought it would be a great injury to the church in every way, if he should go.

The same were expressed by a number present and the pastor was asked what salary would be satisfactory.

He replied ;that he had not called this meeting to consider the question of salary at all; that he was perfectly satisfied with the arrangement as it was, being the nominal salary of Eight Hundred dollars and the growth of the church, but did not want; as had been done, to take the growth of the church to meet the delinquencies of the older members.

He said, that while he had no desire to change his present relations with the church, that if it was thought best to release him from the pastorate, he would apply sufficient of the advance he might get in salary to pay for the lot & liquidate all the indebtedness unprovided for on the church.

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This proposition was discussed freely and fully and the following motion unanimously prevailed:

"That while we appreciate the kind offer of Bro. FARMER, we prefer that he remain with us as pastor and we hereby pledge ourselves to pay the amounts due on the lot and organ and do all that is in our power to assist the pastor in his work among us".

The pastor then suggested that a committee be appointed to canvass the church with him and then to take full charge of the same and relieve him of any further responsibility in the matter in any form and it was so ordered, by motion and the following were appointed such a committee: D.M. BEMAN, WM. P. GREEN, E.F. KNAPP & F.H. PARKER. Moved & carried that ELLA GOODYEAR be granted a letter to unite with the Albion Baptist Church.

Moved and carried that MRS. BROWN be received on her letter from the Charlotte Baptist Ch. Also that MR. ORLANDO & MRS. MAE BROOKS be received on their experience from the Christian Church.

All joined in singing "Blest be the Tie". Deacon GREEN led in prayer. Sang Doxology & were dismissed by the Benediction.

Sunday, April 3,92

The communion was held. 126 were present. MR. & MRS. BROOKS & MISS HULDA STONE received the right hand of fellowship.

Sat. May 7, 1892. The regular covenant meeting was held.

Sat., June 4, 92: The regular covenant meeting was held. Meeting opened by pastor reading 146 psalm and prayer being offered by Deacon GREEN. After singing hymn No. 41, the regular exercises were taken up. 33 adding their testimony on the Lord's side. After singing "Whiter than Snow", the church letter to the association was read and on motion adopted. Letters were granted to Bros. & Sister CHAS. E. PERRY to unite with the Baptist Church at (blank). Closed with prayer by Bro. MIX and DEACON PARKER.

Sat., July 2, 1892. The regular covenant meeting was held.

Sun. July 3, 1892. Rev. MR. JAMISON of Detroit being with us. The annual collection for Home Missions was taken. He preached morning & evening.

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July 10, 1892: The funeral services of sister, HANNAII BELKNAP who died July 8, were held in the church with sermon by the pastor.

The regular covenant meeting was held Aug. 6, 1892. After reading the scriptures, singing and prayer, the regular order of exercises were taken up and all present testified of their love to Christ. After these exercises Bro. & Sister COLLINS were received on their letters from the Gregory Baptist Church. After remarks by Deacon GREEN the hand of fellowship was withdrawn from R.D. ELLSWORTH, MRS. LOTTIE ELLSWORTH, MILDRED ELLSWORTH, CLARENCE WADELL, JOSEPH FANCHER, MRS. JOSEPH FANCHER, GEO. GATES & EDWIN HYATT. Sister LAMB was made a committee to confer with Sister BURTON. Brother ELI UNDERWOOD was made a committee to see Sister BRININGSTOOL and Sister SPRAGUE was made a committee to see MRS. MINNIE SHAW, nee JOHNSON.

Committee in each case to report on or before next covenant meeting. Covenant was read and meeting dismissed by benediction.

Regular communion services were held on Sunday, Aug. 7, 1892 at the regular time. A spirit of devotion was manifest in the meeting.

On Thursday evening, Aug. 11, 1892, MRS. HELEN HOTRUM/NOTRUN, nee BREWER was granted a letter to unite with the Baptist Church at Clinton, MI.

At the regular prayer meeting Thursday, Aug. 18, 1892, Sister LENA HICKS and MRS. ETTA WEEKS were received on their letters from the Jackson Baptist Church. All minutes up to date, read & approved.

Regular covenant meeting Saturday, Sept. 3, 1892, was opened by the pastor reading part of the 8th chapter of Matt, and prayer being offered by Deacon WRIGHT. After singing "Just As I Am", MISS ELLA WALDO was requested to act as Clerk protem.

The regular order of exercises was followed. After singing "All The Way", it was asked that a letter be granted KITTIE and MATTIE WILSON to unite with the First Baptist Church at Jackson, which will be voted on a week from next Thursday night, after the prayer meeting. It was moved and supported that Sister BRININGSTOOL'S name be kept on church book.

Moved & supported that we accept report of committee & continue the name of MRS. MINNIE SHAW, nee JOHNSON. Moved & supported that the hand of fellowship be withdrawn from JERRY SNOW.

Letters From Our Volunteers Pittsburgh Landing, Tenn. May 21st 1862

Friend Saunders: There has but little of interest transpired with us since my last. We have been marched around the country enough to give variety to life, and that is all. After we were attached to Division McClernand's we advanced by easy marches to within one mile of Monterey. At that place we remained nearly a week, when the inefficiency of our Regiment becoming daily more apparent, we were sent back to the Landing. We are completely decimated bv disease. Not very many have died, but the hospitals are over full of the sick. We have been here about ten days and our condition has not improved. Those who are able, are performing guard and picket duty direction of the under provost-marshal.

Our sick are sadly neglected, and in many cases greatly abused. Our surgeons are a nuisance. **Gen.** John A. Logan said publicly that they were not worth bell-room. Ever since Dr. Kedzie left us we have received no care. He was universally liked in the Reg't, and the boys all wish him back again. The following is a list of the sick and dead from Eaton County as nearly as I can ascertain:

Philip Stine of Walton died on a hospital boat bound for the north. Henry Stine, Geo. A. Fink, Wm. Fink and Martin Sprague of Walton, sick and sent north--place unknown. Wm. Nettleton of Walton, in hospital at Hamburg, three miles above this place on the river. Mr. Stroupe, Emery Fink, and myself from Walton, and Daniel Hubbard of Brookfield, sick and off duty, but not in hospital.

O. O. Hamill, Jesse Hayward, Geo. Loveless and D. C. Young of Grand Ledge, sick and sent northward. Simeon Reynolds of Oneida sick and in hospital here, Samuel Chadwick, Wm. Russell and R. Joslyn of Grand Ledge sick but not in hospital.

Gov. Blair is here. The boys, or many of them at least, think we shall see better treatment hereafter. It is to be hoped that we may.

Before closing I must acknowledge the regular receipt of your paper, for which accept my hearty thanks. A soldier loves to hear from home.



The Genealogical Death Indexing System (Gendis) Updated

Michigan Department of Community Health Director James K. Haveman, Jr., today announced that additional years of information have been added to the Genealogical Death Indexing System (GENDIS), and Internet system of Michigan death records from before the turn of the century.

GENDIS, which first appeared on the Internet in April of this year, is a rich resource for historical death record information. This information includes the name of the decedent; the date, place, cause of death; the decedent's occupation; parents' names and residence; and the decedent's place of birth. This indexing system, which is being maintained by the Division for Vital Records and Health Statistics, allows genealogists and others to use key facts, such as the decedent's name or year of death, to locate and view records of interest.

"I am so pleased that this automated indexing system on the Internet is receiving such positive response from our customers," said Haveman. "This is a fine demonstration of how the state can use modern technology to improve service."

This service is possible thanks to the efforts of volunteer genealogists from across the state and with the support of the Michigan Genealogical Council and the Abrams Foundation. This project, which began in 1987, has been conducted under the careful coordination of Margaret Tager Walker. а genealogist and coordinator of the project for the Genealogical Michigan Council. Copies of these early death records are prepared and distributed to volunteer genealogists across the state to be carefully deciphered and These transcriptions transcribed. are then captured electronically and inserted into the data file used by GENDIS.

The lates update provides information on an additional 63, 500 death records to GENDIS data file, which now spans 1867-1882 for a total 148,000 records. When completed, the database will contain approximately 481,000 deaths records for the years 1867 through 1897.

Since April 1998, over 40,000 genealogist and others interested in locating death information have visited the GENDIS Web site. The visitors have shared their appreciation for GENDIS through e-mail.
