Did you Know?

What are fraktur?

Fraktur are decorated manuscripts made by and for German Americans. especially Pennsylvania Germans. Most American fraktur are taufscheins (birth and baptism certificates) made primarily for members of the Lutheran and Reformed families. However fraktur was, and is, practiced by Mennonites, Amish, and other religious affiliations. Most fraktur were made in Southeast Pennsylvania or anywhere Pennsylvania Germans settled such as Ohio, Virginia, Maryland, New Jersey, the Carolinas, and beyond. American fraktur date approximately 1745 into this century. Fraktur was a rural tradition and most were personal documents. Because they were decorated with watercolors they are unlike any other genealogical record. They were meant to be kept by the family and were ordinarily not used as official documents.

In German-speaking areas of Europe, the word "fratur" refers to a style of writing and not a personal document. Of interest, very few European taufscheins are known. Taufscheins are almost entirely an American phenomenon. We believe they were an American expression worth of self and even freedom--freedom from domination by the state, freedom from a sometimes oppressive church, and freedom to own land. Thus fraktur, in this country, has taken on meaning that is greatly expanded beyond a European definition that would be restricted to a decorative style of writing. Most American

fraktur, over 80 percent, is written in German. But with patience and the help of glossaries and study aids, the non-German reader can usually transcribe and translate information from fraktur.

Often overlooked in earlier literature, fraktur are primary sources of genealogical information that is crucial to researchers of German American families. Often information found on fraktur can be found nowhere else. Taufscheins, for example, include mothers' maiden names. Commonly, additional data was added to birth and baptism certificates including dates of confirmation, marriage, and most often, date of death.

German-American fraktur date from the middle of the eighteenth into this century. These documents are primary sources of genealogical information that is often inaccessible to family historians. Fraktur often contain crucial data that is difficult to get from other sources. For example, fratur birth and baptism certificates gives, name, dates, location, plus mother's maiden names and details about family relationships. Some even note that family's religion, and the time of day the child was born.

Obituary

Nettie Belle Rudesill was born in Lenawee county, 32 years ago and married 11 years ago to Charlie Greenfield. She taught school in Lenawee county for some time previous to her marriage, afterward living on a farm until they came to Charlotte three years ago and settled on South Pearl street. She soon made many friends here and was well known as a very bright but quiet Two weeks ago last woman. Tuesday, Mrs. Greenfield was taken to her bed although she had not been feeling well for some time.

Several days later her sickness was She pronounced typhoid fever. apparently was getting along as well as could be expected, until last Friday morning, September 14, when hemorrhages caused her death. Everything was done to save her life but to no avail. Royston, of Eaton Rapids; and Mrs. Charlie

Sanders, of Charlotte; and two brothers, Burt, of this city, and Milton, of Addison, besides a host of relatives. other friends and neighbors. She was a member of the Mystic Workers and was treasurer of the Home Reading Circle. The Mystic Workers and Foresters of America, with whom the bereaved husband was associated. attended the funeral, which was held Sunday, from the home of F. McDonald, Rev. Austin, officiating.

First Reunion of Gresham School 1924

Interesting Event was held Thursday at Village Church

The Gresham School reunion was held August 21 at Gresham The School across the Church. corner was open, so anyone could go in. About 10:30 people began to arrive. As this was our first reunion, it was all of 35 years since those about my age had met here. This was at a Sunday School and young people's reunion of 35 years ago, as well as school reunion. Of course, many of those of our parents, companions were there too, three Williams boys, Maurice, George, and Levi, being the oldest except Mrs. Lvdia Harmon. Then came Chas. Stall and wife, Amy Moore Andrews and Martha Hampton Clemens, and so on down. Such visiting and recalling of old time incidents. But to me the bunch of " boys" George, Gene, Jim, Dell, Henry and Fred and "girls" of their ages, Etta, Pearl, Jennie, Cora, Blanche and Lena to be together once more in that church seemed wonderful. I mention these because they were the ones from away who came back for this day and who were my early school mates and social friends.

Then in looking the crowd over I saw so many who were my pupils in 1887 and later, as I have taught there four different times, children of my first pupils being in school in 1920 when I taught. Among familiar **Clyde, Maude,** Edith, Gertie, faces of olden days were Milo, Ezra, Hattie and Phebe, Ruby, Nora, and a number of younger ones, many years since they had all met together too.

Mrs. Sophia Mills Shotwell, now living in Charlotte, was my first teacher in 1876. She was present and when called to the front 11 of her pupils of 48 years ago came and stood with her. This seemed wonderful to us all.

Eleven former teachers were present: Mrs. Shotwell, Mrs. Effie Barr Brown, Mrs. Nettie Phillips, Mrs. Jennie Barnes, Mrs. Myrtle Arnold, Mrs. Lynn Hicks, Mrs. Gertrude Prindle, Mrs. Martha Goodrich, Mrs. Ruby Phillips, Mrs. Mary Barr and Zella Mc Connell.

As each Teacher's name was read she came forward and all her former pupils stood in line with her. **Mrs. Nettie Phillips** had 29 present and **Mrs. James Brown** came next with 23.

A potluck dinner was served in the church basement to 147, and six more came in the afternoon making a total of 153. Parents who lived here years ago also were present: Frank West and children: Milo and Mable Jackson and a Charlotte: Gene number from Barnes and wife came over from Kalamazoo and Henry and Fred Campbell and wives and Mrs. Nellie Fletcher from Lansing; Rhoda Bursley from Eaton Rapids. On account of other family gatherings many from Charlotte were kept away.

Mrs. Myrtle Arnold was elected president for next year, and Nettie Phillips secretary; Dell Haigh. Treasurer; Mary Barr. Register; Pearl Betts, historian. Many families of three generations were present. Many expressed the joy of the day by saying they never enjoyed a day better and never expected to. It was a day of happiness from start to finish. The "boys" I have mentioned used to say " Gresham against the World" and I think it still holds good.

Mrs. Gertrude Prindle and Claire Taylor spoke of the educational benefit of such a meeting. One remark should guide all social features of the country was "the future of the locality depends upon how many of the boys and girls would stay with mother and father to carry on".

Asa Smart was an attendant at the school and had children, grand children, and great grand children who had attended, four generations.

Mrs. Gertrude Prindle Cole of Grand Rapids was present. The new officers elected are Mrs. Gertrude Garns, president; Mrs. Emma Nachtrich, secretary; Mrs. Adelbert Haigh, treasurer and Pearl Betts, historian. The next meeting will be the second Tuesday in August at Gresham.

Mrs. John Sacket was present and told of her experiences in the Colorado wreck. One humorous situation was finding a black porter weeping and holding his head and they asked him if he was badly hurt? He said, "No but all my cut glass is broke, broken and lost". She with Willa Wheaton and James Ames of Vermontville were in the first car next the baggage car. It was a miracle they ever lived to return.

To give a list of the people from Charlotte who were present, Friday would make one think, all had moved to the city. Claire Taylor spoke as if to farmers, but three-fourths of the audience were city dwellers. However, his remarks were to the young and those who are on the farms and were excellent. He himself is a city dweller.

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

PEARL ROGERS of EATON COUNTY, MI. 1844-1903

Pearl Rogers was born in Lenawee County, Michigan on August 24, 1844, son of A. Samuel and Weltha (Clark) Rogers. They came to Eaton County in 1857 settling in Sunfield Township.

Pearl owned several acres of land in Carmel Township. He was a farmer as were many of his sons. After many years of farming, being a husband and father to several children, Pearl and his wife Elnora Green, daughter of Eri A. and Joanna (Kelley) Green moved in the city of Charlotte. The old brick house still stands at the north end of Charlotte at 938 S. Cochran Avenue. The Owens/Brockway factory is built on some of the original land.

Some time after Pearl Rogers died [October 30, 1903], the land became the site of the Charlotte Brewing Company. The 1908-1909 Moore's Standard Directory of Charlotte, Mich. has an ad for the Brewing Company which states they were "Brewers of Pale Ales and London Porter". As early as 1901 an ad is shown in the Michigan Gazetteer listing Louis Blessing, President, of Jackson, C.A. Pendleton, V.P., of Leslie, and Albert Porter as Secy/Treas. and General Manager. The last time they appeared in a Michigan State Gazetteer was the 1907-08 issue. The site also is shown on a 1927 Sanford Insurance Map. Does anyone know when the brewery went out of business?

Children of Nancy Elnora Green and Pearl Rogers were also well-known throughout Eaton County. They were: Giles, Clinton, Samuel, Clark, Jennie (Bosworth),William, Rutherford B., Ellen (Patterson), Grace (Baker), Eria, and Pearl.

Nov. 26th, 1870, she was married to **Nelson O. Merritt** (our present postmaster) and they took up their residence in Potterville, Mich., where they have since resided, excepting about five years while they owned and lived on the farm north of town now owned by **Herman Davis**.

To this union five children were born of whom four survive, viz: Dr. Clark N. Merritt and Mrs. Grace Cook of Lansing, Harry E. Merritt, traveling salesman, and Dr. R. Fern Merritt of Albion,--all of whom with the husband mourn her seemingly early demise.

Mrs. Merritt was a member of the M.E. church and the Women's Relief Corps, and highly respected by all who knew her.

The funeral is being conducted at the residence today **Rev. W.W. Exner** officiating assited by **Rev. O.J. Golden** of Elsie, her former pastor, and her remains will be laid to rest in the Potterville cemetery-**Edwards & Barker**, funeral direcotrs

Death of Dr. F.A. Weaver

Dr. Frank A. Weaver, brother of Dr. Leroy F. Weaver, died last Friday in an Oakland, California, hospital.

On account of failing health Dr. Weaver closed up his business interest here, turning over his practice to his brother, Dr. Leroy F. Weaver, and in September left for Oakland, California, to reside with his youngest son, Dr. Don D. Weaver. He had not been there long until taken ill and taken to the North Bay sanitarium. He recovered in a few weeks and was appointed as ship surgeon on a Pacific steamship line running from San Francisco to Panama, New Zealand, Australia, and returning via Sandwich Islands. After several days out at sea he was taken ill and transferred to a sister ship returning to San Francisco. He reentered the Sanitarium at Oakland where he remained until death.

Dr. Frank A. Weaver was born in Benton township in 1858 and pursued the usual course of the country boy, attending district school and as he advanced, entered the Charlotte and Lansing High Schools. He studied medicine with Dr. C. E. Ranney of Lansing for 18 months and then entered the Detroit College of medicine, graduating therefrom in 1881. He began his practice of his profession at Chester Station, coming to Charlotte soon after where he remained until last September. He enjoyed a very extensive practice throughtout Eaton county. During his residence in Charlotte he was active and prominent in the social, political and fraternal life of the city and county. At one time he was a member of the Democratic state central committee from the third congressional district. In Masonry he was esteemed and respected, serving in the various bodies until he became eminent commander of Charlotte Commandery.

A Public funeral will be held at the Masonic Temple Sunday, March 15, two p.m., he having disposed of his home here following the death of his wife, a prominent Michigan Club woman, three years ago.

He is survived by two sons, Dr. Don D. Weaver of Oakland, Cal., and Prof. Hal Weaver of the University of Texas, three brothers, Dr. L.F. Weaver of this city, C.C. Weaver, one of the substantial farmers of Benton township, and George Weaver of Lansing.

Sheikes Of 1850 Carried Boots To Dance Under Their Arms As Economy Measure

Not all Swains owned footwear and those who did, guarded it jealously, Mulliken man says.

Mulliken May 2, 1924

How the "Shriks" of the early fifties carried their patent leather boots to the dance under their arms, putting them on after they arrived there just to save wear on them is related by **William Root** of this place who will be 91 years old next August 18th.

Boots and shoes were expensive in those days, Mr. Root said. A pair of boots such as the young men wore then cost about \$ 7 and by the way \$7 was \$7at that time.

Few of the fellows would dance in their boots after they got there, but would take them off and stack them next to the wall, where they could keep an eye on the.

Swains Shoeless

Going barefoot was the common thing then. I remember when I was a boy and my family lived on a farm near Cleveland, we seldom had shoes to wear, even in the winter.

You see there were 14 of us kids and shoes for all would have run into money. Shortly after coming to Michigan, Mr. Root said, he was ask to take part in a logging bee. The field where the men were to work had been heavily grown up with thistles and the farmer had just mowed these with a sythe.

Mr. Root said his feet were so toughened by going barefoot that he worked among the dried thistles all day without feeling any pain.

Mr. Root was a great lover of the woods in his younger days and he boasts he seldom missed hitting a squirrel in the head with a rifle, even if the animal were in the tallest tree.

Despite his years, Mr. Root still is hale and hearty and retains the use of all his faculties.

His sense of hearing is only slightly effected and he reads without glasses daily.

Mr. Root served though the Civil War in the 23rd Ohio Regiment under **Rutherford B. Hayes**. He first saw action in the battle of Antietam, arriving there as a raw recruit in the thickness of the fight.

Served Under McKinley

He was honorably discharged June 13, 1865 at Cumberland, Maryland, William McKinley being his captain at that time. George and Joe, two brothers of Mr. Root served through the war in the same company with him. Mr. Root has been married three times. His first wife and infant son died while he was serving in the Union army. He and his second wife raised a family of nine children.

Mr. Root's father, when a young man, walked from Connecticut and settled on a farm near the latter place. At that time Cleveland consisted of just three log cabins.

This appeared in the Grand Rapids Herald May 2, 1924.

Note: Grandpa William Root met his young brother George on the Battle field, both their faces were black from gun powder smoke. He exclaimed to brother George, "My God, George what are you doing here". He didn't know his brother was in the war. William Root's children were George W., Ida, Vira, Lillie, Alma, Fred, Alfred, Ruby, and Leonard dying at age 21.
