Simeon McCotter

Vermontville Colonist by M. J. Baker

Simeon McCotter was the next to the last male survivor of the Vermontville colonists, and was an excellent citizen. Physically he was a stubbed man, short in stature, with a quick movement, a cabinet-maker by trade, and the workman who did all kinds of woodwork for the first settlers.

Mr. McCotter made cradles for newborns and coffins for those who passed from this life. He was the first work and the last for many, young and old, whose bodies lie in the rural cemetery. He was considered the general utility man for all; working on houses and barns; on the schoolhouse; the first sawmill; the academy and the church. He knew how to put things together. How the other colonists would have gotten along without him, or some one else like him, is not clear.

While he owned an outside farm lot - a wild and heavily timbered eighty acres - he always lived in the village, on one of the ten-acre lots which fell to him in the raffle that the colonists cast lots for. He later added three more adjacent lots of the same size.

Born in Benson, Rutland County, Vermont, August 30, 1806, Simeon McCotter came to Vermontville as one of the original colonists and lived there until his death, November 15, 1893. He married Lucy Minerva Leveredge at Vermontville, April 1, 1840. She was

born at Camillus, NY, April 20, 1819, and died in Vermontville, Aug. 4, 1895.

Four children were born to Simeon and Lucy McCotter. They were Mary Jennette McCotter, born April 13, 1841. She married Oscar Hadley July 4, 1857. James McCotter. Howard was January 3, 1845 and in March 1874 he married Florence Baker. He lived on Lawrence Ave. in Charlotte for a few years and then moved to Pontiac, Mich., where he became superintendent of the D. M. Ferry & Company's seed farm, having fitted himself for the position as a student and graduate of the Michigan Agricultural College. Eliza McCotter was born Oct. 20, 1849 and married Fitz Hughes Gage of Olivet, MI. on Oct. 20, 1886. George Samuel McCotter was born May 30, 1851 and married Caroline DePlanta in 1875. They lived at Hudson, MI.

There are many artifacts, including his woodworking tools, housed at the Vermontville Museum. Simeon built one of the first frame homes in Vermontville and is credited with the gingerbread trim that is on the porches and also for the trim on many of the homes in Vermontville. Simeon McCotter's

In the name of God, Amen: I Simeon McCotter, of Vermontville, Eaton County, Michigan, being of sound mind and memory, but mind of the uncertainly of this life, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, as follows:

First: I desire that my just debts and the expenses of my last sickness and of my burial and of a suitable monument be paid out of my personal estate, or if that be not sufficient therefore, out of my real estate, to be raised by a mortgage of said real estate to be executed by my executor hereinafter named, payable after the death of my beloved wife.

Second: I give, bequeath and devise unto my beloved wife, Minerva I. McCotter, in case she survives me, all my real and personal estate, of whatever kind or nature, and wherever interests to have and hold, use and enjoy, for and during her material life, - and if the annual proceeds thereof are not sufficient for her comfortable support, I do hereby authorize my executor hereinafter named to sell or dispose of any part thereof and apply the proceeds of the same to her support.

Third: Upon and after the decease of my said wife, in case she survives, me, I direct that all of my property

then unassuming undisposed of, be divided and distributed as follows. I desire that the various articles presented to us or either of us by our children be returned and redisposed to the several donors; that a just allowance be made by the Probate Court to my son James H. McCotter for the various necessaries and comforts by him applied to us during recent years, and be paid to him although he has made no charge therefor; and that all the residence of said state be divided in equal shares between my sons, James H. McCotter, George S. McCotter, my daughter, Eliza Gage and my grand-daughter Effie Sackett, or in case of the death of either, his or her share to go to his or her children.

Fourth: In case I shall survive my said wife, I direct that at my death, all my estate be divided and distributed in the same manner as provided in the first and third clauses of this will, without any intervening life estate

Fifth: I hereby nominate and appoint my friend **Sidney S. Rockwell** of Vermontville to be sole executor and trustee under this will, witness my hand and seal this 20th day of July A.D. 1891. (Signed by **Simon McCotter**)






BOSWORTH: At her home in Chester township-January 8, 1892. Mrs. Almira Bosworth, wife of Kelly Bosworth, aged _ (?)__ years.

Mrs. Bosworth, whose death occurred January 8, was born in Ohio, February 25, 1830 Maiden name was Almina Bark. She was married to Kelly Bosworth in August 1850 and has been his faithful companion for nearly 42 vears. Upon their marriage they at once removed to Eaton county, where the husband had already purchased a farm and prepared a home. The woods have been turned into fertile fields, the former cabin has given place to a large residence. and the rude stables have been changed for commodious barns. Mrs. Bosworth has been a faithful companion a loving mother and kind neighbor. Six children have blessed this happy union, 5 boys and one girl. All but one still live. All are grown to industrious manhood. It is a credit to Mrs. Bosworth to have reared such a family.

She was a member of the grange, also of the Daughters of Rebecca. Kind-hearted and charitable by nature, she was constantly doing deeds of love and mercy, and yet she never sought praise for her acts of kindness. She never advertised her charities. Her life was a psalm of love, and her presence was always sunshine. It is certain that the world is better because she has lived. Funeral services were held from her home,

by Rev. F. McAlpine on Sunday, January 11, 1892, at one o'clock p.m. Excellent music was rendered by the Universalist choir of Charlotte, under charge of E. H. Bailey. The unusually large attendance, notwithstanding the inextremely cold weather attests the esteem in which Mrs. Bosworth was held. Truly, a noble worman has gone to her reward.

Mrs. Dickinson was the youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E.C. King of this city. At an early age she in a remarkable way seemed to realize the importance of her life work and to feel that there is a purpose in life and this she was working out quietly, unostentatiously and nobly in her every day work on the farm. Her death is an irreparable loss to her husband and a family of small children, and a calamity to the neighborhood. The funeral was held Thursday from the Baptist church of city, Rev. F.O. Dickey, officiating, and the remains placed at rest in Maple Hill cemetery.

SEARLES:

At her residence on South Cochrane avenue, Tuesday evening, January 5, 1892, after a short illness of pleuro-pneumonia, Mrs. Elma Searles, wife of Caleb Searles, aged 58 years.

Mrs. Searles was born in New Baltimore, N.Y., where she was married to Mr. Searles, December 21, 1858. About nineteen years ago Mr. and Mrs. Searles settled in Charlotte whre they have ever since resided. Mrs. Searles never united with a church but held rather to the principles of her parents who were quakers. She could get good out of any sermon and lived an ideal life, taking Christ as her pattern. Benjamin Bedell and family of Lansing, were in attendance and are spending the week with Mr. Searles.

STRICKLAND:

After a short illness of one week at her home in Chester on Friday, October 9, 1891, of congestion of the stomach, Mrs. Emily Stickland, wife of Lewis A. Strickland, aged 48 years and 9 months.

She was a daughter of Isaac and Esther J. Williams, and was born upon the farm where she died. She leaves a sorrowing husband and three children to mourn the loss of a devoted wife and mother. Mrs. Strickland had been a member of the Baptist church for many years and was held in very high esteem wherever known. Her funeral which occurred Friday was very largely attended, Rev. North, of the M.E. Church officiating.

Rev. Marcus H. Martin, A.M., rector of Grace Episcopal church, is a native of the Green Mountain state. His later boyhood was passed in Troy, N.Y., where he was educated in the common schools. While a merchant's clerk he prepared himself by evening study and such tuition as was at hand for Union college, Schenectady, N.Y. On graduation he received the first classical honor of his class. Taking, then, the principalship of Troy high school, he filled for some years the position with credit, establishing a high reputation for many students to Union, Williams, Harvard and Yale. Later he was made superintendent of the Troy schools and added much to their efficiency, forming and training the first normal class in that Resigning, he accepted the professorship of Greek and Latin in the Trenton, N.J., state normal school, with the special charge of the model department. There he fitted many young men for Princeton college, some of whom are now in the Presbyterian ministry. While in Treton he was ordained to the Episcopal ministry by Bishop Scarborough and thereafter did much Sunday clerical work, but retained his professorship. He in Trenton. and established. conducted on Sundays a large mission school, now as independent church. Wishing greater freedom for ministerial work than was consistent with the duties of his professorship. he resigned and removed to Detroit, Mich., where he conducted, as a private school, a seminary for young ladies, for nine years. During this time he was the associate of Dr. Rufus Clark, of St. Paul's church, rendered constant clerical and

Sunday service. Double duty threatening his health, he decided to drop educational work and devote all his time to the ministry. Accepting a call to Calvary church, Toledo, Ohio, with charge, also, of St. Paul's, Maumee, he removed to the former city. Three and a half years in this field of divided charges, and much riding in all kinds of weather, again threatening health, he sought a lighter field. On joint appointment by Bishop Gillespie, and call of the officers of Grace church, he came, to Charlotte in January last. Martin, is a man of decided literacy tastes, and finds time, outside his profession, for considerable work in that line. When president of the New Jersey State Association Teachers. important and on educational committees, he rendered good service. Since retirement from school work he has resisted numerous soliciations and fine offers to resume it. His face is. however, steadfastly set to work henceforth in the Master's vineyard. He was born in the ministry eighteen years. He is of Scotch-Irish and English ancestry, and nephew of Wells R. Martin, of Vermontville, well known as one of the pioneers of About twenty-five Eaton county. years ago Mr. Martin united his fortunes with Miss Caroline M. King, daughter of Hon. John King, of New York. Mrs. Martin is of Scotch extraction and a lady of rare ability. She is a graduate of the Emma Willard once famous seminary. Mr. & Mrs. Martin's only living child is Miss Annie Martin who has already won more than a local reputation as an accomplished pianinte.
