

#### **Power of Attorney**

Victor Emanuel the III by Grace of God and Will of Nation, King of Italy

The year 1919, the 20th, of March in Cosenza and in my Nortarial Office situated in the vicinity of Piazza Antonio Toscano, Via Privata, own building.

Before me Francesco Goffredo, Nortary of Cosenza, inscribed in the Notarial Hall of the united Districts of Cosenza, and Rossano, and in the presence of Ernesto Perugini son of the late Pasquale, and Tommaso Farsetti son of the late Francesco, proprietors, born and domiciled the first named at Rende, and the second at Fagnano Castello, witnesses qualified and personally known.

Have appeared: Angelina DeRose daughter of the late Raffaele, farmer, born and domiciled in Sant'Ippolito personally known by me Notary, who states that on the 2nd of January 1919 died in Grand Ledge, Mich., following an illness, her husband Gaspare DeRose son of Salvatore leaving there a small estate to be settled. And she being unable to go there herself, feels the necessity to appoint an attorney and by these presents do name and constitute Chev. Pietro Cardiello, Royal Consular Agent for Italy, at Detroit, Michigan her lawfull attorney, and in her name and stead to settle the estate left by said deceased Gaspare DeRose son of Salvatore, and to collect any and all sums of money whereever deposited, executing and delivering any and all releases and discharges.

And she do gives unto her said attorney full power to do and perform all and every act whatsoever necessary to be done in and about the premises hereby ratifying and confirming all that he may do by virture hereof.-----

Said constituent does not sign having declared to be unable to write.-----

And I notary requested have drawn up the present act, which, in the presence of the witnesses was by me read to the constituent, who previously asked, acknowledges same to be in conformity to her will.

#### TIME FOR A LITTLE KNAPP

#### By Mary Jean Baker

#### **Early Knapp Family**

The first Knapp to come to Eaton County was Ezra W. Knapp who was born in Vermont in 1805. He was a blacksmith when he moved to Franklin Twp., Lenawee County in 1845. He purchased land in Section 25 of Chester Twp. In 1835 he was married to Polly Wise, who was born in Clay Twp., Onondaga Co., NY in 1817. Her parents were Daniel Wise & Dorothy Shaver. Ezra died in Chester Twp. in 1851.

Their five children included Julie A. Knapp, who became the wife of Samuel Payne of Charlotte. Silas E. Knapp was born 23 Aug. 1860 in Eaton County. Zera Knapp died in Monroe County at the age of three. Mary E. Knapp was the wife of Frank G. Pierce of Hastings, Barry County. She was born 3 December 1865 and Sally Knapp born 25 October 1879 in Charlotte became the wife of Uriel M. Bennett, Jr.

Silas married Miss Sarah Bennett, who was born in Allegany County, New York, February 26, 1839. She died August 13, 1900 on the home farm. Her parents were Urial W. & Jane (Ferris) Bennett, both of who were born in Yates County, New York. Mr. Bennett came to Eaton County in 1854 after his wife died. He married the widowed mother of Silas.

**Silas & Sarah Knapp** were parents of eight children as follows:

Julie, born Sept. 30, 1862-28 Aug. 1946. She lived in Battle Creek. George M., born Nov. 25, 1864-20 Oct. 1922. He lived on the farm. Myrtle, Born Nov. 8, 1867-30 Aug. 1915. She lived in Evanston, IL Viola, born Nov. 1, 1866, lived with dad.

Laura, born Nov. 27, 1870. Lived at Battle Creek.

Olive, wife of Edward McWithie of Battle Creek.

Jay, lived at Battle Creek. Vera, lived at Battle Creek.

(Only one child was married by the time the book, *Past & Present of Eaton County*, was written).

Some of these Knapp's are buried in Maple Hill Cemetery, Charlotte, MI

Tues. Sept. 18

Ma and Jimmie went to the farm this morning Mae was hear, she is out of Van Ziles Office because he is sick.

Wed, Sept. 19

Ma was hear this evening.

Thurs, Sept. 20

Ma and I was up town this aff. I wrote a letter to Tommie.

Fri. Sept. 21

Mae and I went down to Letties and stayed all day.

Sat. Sept. 22

Went up town and also down to see Hattie Curray.

Sun. Sept. 23

Ma was sick and I was up nearly all night with her.

Mon. Sept. 24



# Obits and Memorials from Eaton County Pioneer Society Records Volume 1

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McKee-----After an illnesss of five days, at the home of W. P. Wyman, in this city, on Monday, at 2 a.m., of tonsilitis and heart affection, Robert F. McKee, aged 25 years 10 months and 12 days.

The news of Mr. McKee's death fell like a thunderbolt upon our inhabitants, many of whom had not heard of his short illness, and it was hard to realize that he who has long been looked upon in this city as its best representative of physical Mr. McKee manhood was dead. was born in Laingsburg, Shiawassee county, October 19, 1865. At the age of fourteen he left the paternal home and since that time has made his own way in the world. For two vears thereafter he made his home with Charles Gale, of the firm of Gale Bros.. When in the hardware business at Eaton Rapids, and he had valuable experience in Marshall and elsewhere in the hardware line before he came to Charlotte which was in March, 1884, when he entered the employ of W. H. Dudley. Upon Mr. Dudley's retirement, Mr. McKee was retained by Mr. Thomas J. Green and later also by Mr. Green's successor, Mr. William P. Wyman. About a year after Mr. Wyman purchased the business, Mr. McKee, who was his brother-in-law, was taken in as partner under the firm name of Wyman & McKee and it is generally conceded that Mr.

McKee had no superior in the hardware business central Michigan. He was married September, 10, 1890, to Miss Estella Lamont, of Eaton, and his prospects could not have well been brighter. He was a general favorite as was evidenced last spring when, running against a popular man, he was elected treasurer of this city by a vote of 555 to 403 for his opponent, thus greatly leading his ticket. In all athletic exercises he was an oft participant and was almost universally successful. Our readers remember the will remarkable record he has made at shooting tournaments, and in a batch of special sports he usually won a half of all prizes offered. He knew no such word as fail and was as successful in his business as in the sports in which he so much delighted. The funeral will be held this afternoon from the residence of Mr. Wyman, where Mr. and Mrs. McKee have remained since the death of Mr. and Mrs. Wyman's little child three weeks ago. officiating. Among the friends from a distance who are in attendance are Hon. Robert E. McKee and wife, of Laingsburg, Mr. McKee;s father and mother, and Charles W. Gale, of The former were not Morrice. notified of his sickness in time to arrive before his death. He was an only son and his death is the first to occur in their family. The common council held a special session Monday evening and passed appropriate resolutions, in memory of their brother officer, which appear elsewhere in this issue.

Allen----At his residence on South Cochran avenue, of cholera morbus.

on Monday, August 24, 1891, Earl B. Allen, aged 80 years, 3 months and 18 days.

The deceased was born in Springfield, Mass., May 6, 1811. When 19 years of age he traveled on foot from Ontario county, New Ork, via of Canada to Michigan carrying a gun and pack. He returned to new York, had thrilling adventures at sea on a "whaler" going as far as the Indian Ocean where in a ten months cruise they did not made a landing. He settled in Walton, Eaton county, in June, 1839, and in March following was married to Miss Eliza Campbell whose parents came from New York and settled in Lenawee county in 1836. Mrs. Allen and their only child, Mrs. Edwin Scott, of Walton, survive him. The funeral will be held today at 10 a.m. from the residence, Rev. A. D. Newton officiating, and the remains will be taken to the Bosworth cemetery. Walton, for interment.

Baughman-----At his home in this city, on Saturday, August 1, 1891, after a painful illness of four weeks, Henry Baughman, aged 76 years, 5 months and 18 days.

The deceased was born in Cumberland county, Pennsylvania, February 13, 1815, and was married to **Miss Catherine C. Armstrong**, April 1, 1836, in Richland county, Ohio. In June, 1854, himself and family settled in Eaton county on what is known as the **Ames** farm just south of this city. He kept the old Eagle hotel for a time and for many years drove a team between here and Battle Creek, carrying the mail until the railroad was built. For the greater part of the time the office of justice of the peaces and been best

known as Esquire Baughman. During his long sickness the friends and neighbors have been especially kind and thoughtful, all of which is greatly appreciated by the mourning relatives. The funeral was held Monday afternoon from the residence, Rev. George D. Lee officating. Mr. Baughman was an Odd Fellow and the brethen of the order attended in a body and took charge of the burial services. During long acquaintance with the deceased we never heard a word lisped against him and it is safe to say that he was uniberantly beloved and esteemed. His widow and seven children survive him. All were present at the funeral excepting W. F. Baughman, the youngest son, who failed to get the telegram in time to reach here before the funeral.

Turner----At her home in this city of lagrippe, Saturday, January 9, 1892, Mrs. Jane E. Turner, wife of Thomas Turner, age 69 yers, 3 months and 6 days.

# The Difficult History of Delta Township by Mary Jean Baker

The township of Delta is located in the extreme northeast corner of Eaton County.

A greater variety of pioneer experiences, hardships, more wanderings in the wilderness, more loneliness and more dense crowding took place in the Delta area.

Bellevue had one entrance pathway followed by all, and this was mainly through "oak openings" where a first trail was easily formed. Vermontville, with its thrilling experiences, was settled by a colony where many mutual friends came closely in together. Delta was entered by four different routes, each woods dense and through interminable swamps: the first incomer over each cutting a path from ten to forty miles which was so obscured before others followed it that it was difficult or impossible to trace, and these followers were often lost over night and sometimes for several days.

Thirty-six purchases of government land were recorded in 1836 and only one purchase preceding this and that by the first settler, **Erastus Ingersoll**, in 1835. He purchased eight hundred acres lying upon both sides of Grand River. He was the father of six sons, all well known afterwards throughout this and adjoining counties. The oldest son, **Erastus S. Ingersoll**, perhaps the best known of them all, was elected the first township supervisor. He was a Sunday school

superintendent and later State agent of Sunday schools.

In the spring of 1836, Mr. Ingersoll employed Anthony Niles and Herman Thomas, residing in Eagle, to build a log cabin on his newly purchased lands. In September, Mr. Ingersoll, along with Clinton Burnet and a Mr. Avery, went to (now Windsor) this land with his family, doubtless the first settler in this quarter of the county. They left Farmington, Oakland following the Grand River turnpike to Howell, turned northward to the Lookingglass River which they followed to the present site of DeWitt. From here they cut southwesterly, with only a pocket compass, to his log cabin already erected, a distance of ten or more miles. The labor and trial of such a task is inconceivable. His next task was to dam the Grand River and begin building a sawmill. The mill was only partially finished when on the last of December, 1836, the first board was sawed with the aid of handspikes. Addison Hayden was head mechanic in building the mill but the following spring the dam was swept away.

The next settlers were a Mr. Lewis and his son-in-law, Erza Billings. They came from the south cutting their road from Eaton Rapids, enduring hardships all the way. Mrs. Lewis died soon after their arrival. The wagon-box in which she had arrived, was cut up to make a coffin for her burial.

Provisions ruled very high, pork being \$40 and flour \$14 a barrel. There were no vegetables until the following spring. A Mr. Butterfield came down the river in the spring with a boat laden with

much needed potatoes. It cost \$2 a bushel for those potatoes.

In June of 1837 the Rev. E. P. Ingersoll and Dr. Jennings of Oberlin and others from Ohio and Massachusetts came from Howell bringing two yoke of oxen and four cows. They cut their own roads through the dense forest the entire forty miles, built bridges, dug down hillsides, removed obstructions and encountered many trying delays. On Saturday night they encamped on the banks of the Cedar River and observed the Sabbath as a day of rest and religious worship.

Later Thomas Chadwick arrived accompanied by other Ingersolls with more yoke of oxen and a span of horses. On the first day they came to an open marsh and testing the strength of its turf thought it sufficient to venture upon with the horse team. Half way over the horses broke through and mired. When released from the wagon, they managed to get across. This happened with a second team. Cutting long poles and with chains, they finally managed to bring the wagons out, safely to shore. They had to start carrying much of the load on their backs in order to lighten the wagons. By the third day they reached Delta Mills from Howell. Wondrous was the capacity of a small log house in those pioneer days. The one they stayed in now sheltered twenty-six persons.

In March, Mr. Compton and Mr. Cronkite, future settlers in Eagle, arrived with their families from Eaton Rapids, having made the trip on the ice. The ice was now melting rapidly and was free from the shore.

They shouted lustily for assistance and with poles to construct a bridge, they were able to land safely.

Soon a mail route was established from Jacksonburg (Jackson) to Ionia. Roads proving impassable were soon discontinued.

Some of the founders of Delta were as religiously zealous and as intellectually aspiring as the founders of Vermontville but less successful in their enterprise. Erastus Ingersoll bought a large tract of land and his brother, Rev. E. P. Ingersoll, came with the purpose of founding a college planned after the model of Oberlin. In fact, the Rev. J.J. Shipherd, founder of Oberlin and who also founded Olivet, came with these two brothers in 1835, and assisted in selecting the land.

In an essay by Mr. E. S. Ingersoll, he includes 'fourteen points'.

- 1. The first settler, Erastus Ingersoll.
- 2. The first dwelling, his log cabin.
- 3. The first improvements, his dam and sawmill.
- 4. The first hotel, by E. S. Ingersoll.
- 5. The first postmaster, E. S. Ingersoll.
- 6. The first election, in fall of 1838.
- 7. The first minister of the gospel, Rev. E. P. Ingersoll.
- 8. The first child born (a girl), 1838.
- 9. The first church organized in 1851.
- 10. The first permanent pastor, Rev. Wm. P. Esler.
- 11. The first schoolhouse, built in 1839.
- 12. The first school teacher, Lydia Ingersoll.
- 13. The first public school teacher, Miss Sally Chadwick.

14. The first marriage, 1838, Addison Hayden & Mary Chadwick.

On June 11, 1841, a village plat was laid out extending from the river to the turnpike. This was given the name of Grand River City but the name failed of general adoption. It remained "Delta Mills" for many years. In earlier years, Whitney Jones established a store here after purchasing a considerable portion of the "plat." He moved to Detroit in 1845, but after the capital was located in Lansing in 1847, he came to that place where he remained.

The first settler on the south side of the river was **Gebet Brown** who came via Jacksonburg (Jackson) and Eaton Rapids, stopping in Windsor at the shanties of **Mr. Towslee** and **John D. Skinner.** 

Thomas Parsons was an early settler in the southeast corner of the township. His son, not the brightest, gathered sap with two buckets, became lost and traveled forty miles carrying those buckets slung to a yoke on his shoulders and searching for his home.

Allowing for exaggeration, the pioneers of Delta certainly left some interesting stories.

Delta had been a part of Oneida until February 16, 1842, when by act of legislature it was created into a separate township and "the first election shall be at the schoolhouse near Ingersoll's mill." The election resulted as follows: For Supervisor, E. S. Ingersoll; Clerk,

# Letters from Our Volunteers

The Republican Newspaper- of Charlotte
Dated Friday March 28, 1862

Fayette, Mo., March 13th, 1862.

We are now realizing the monotony of camp life to its fullest extent. Now and then a small detachment is sent out scouting, but they usually bring in nothing. This is not because there is no secesh about here, but because they dare not show themselves in public. There is probably not a place of its size in Missouri, where the inhabitants entertain a more bitter hatred to federals, or "fed," as they call them, than at Fayette. It is true there are some good Union People here, but the most of them are the hotest kind of secesh, and do not scruple to exporess their opinions, whenever they can do so with safety to themselves. The men say but little, but the women take advantage of the privilege shown to their sex, and express their hatred to our soldiers in every One incident I will possible manner. mention. A loyal woman of this place has been in the habit of baking pies, cakes, &c., and sending them into camp, to sell to the boys. Another good woman of the place, in talking with her about it, said that if she ever baked anything for the "Fed," she should put in arsenic. A lady was recently arrested and brought before Capt. Hale for wearing a confederate flag upon her bonnet into church on the Sabbath. She came up as pert as a house pig and said she should wear just what she pleased. She is still under arrest; what will be done with her I cannot say.

Yesterday we were called to attend the funeral of one of our company who came with us from Mich. He was a young man by the name of **Scovil**, from Maple Grove, and was attacked about a week ago with the measles, which finally terminated in the typhoid fever. He was buried with military ceremonies. But as these are new to you perhaps a brief description of the order of proceedings will not be uninteresting.

The corpse was enclosed in a neat, plain coffin, and carried to the grave by six pallbearers about his own agen and size.

An escort of nine were selected, of which I happened to be one. The escort was marched to the hospital, mounted and armed and formed in line facing the hospital, and stood at "present sabre," while the corpse was brought out and placed in the wagon. We then marched to the grave in front of the hearse with drawn sabre. On either side of the hearse were the pall beares, and following that the remainder of the company, and in rear of that the other companies in uniform but unmounted. The escort was drawn up in line in front of the grave after the corpse was let down and stood with uncovered heads, while the Chaplain read a chapter and made a prayer that was appropriate. Three rounds, or twenty-seven guns were then fired over the grave, and we returned to camp.

As the procession was passing through town on the way to the grave, one of the citizens made the very consoling remark in the hearing of nearly all, that he wished we were all in the same place, and if he could have his way, he would soon put us there. As the train was returning a detachment was taken out and brought the gentlman to head quarters, a prisoner. He was told plainly that he would remain a prisoner full as long as he wished. If I were in command I should put an end to his gab in a hurry.

Ship Island, Gulf of Mexico)
March 18th, 1862 }

Friend Saunders:—— As it has been nearly a month since we heard from Michigan, and about two weeks since we have been gladened b the sight of a letter or newspaper from any source, it occurred to me that some of our friends might desire to learn something of our welfare.

The voyage from Fortress Monroe, to this place, was without special interest. We had the usual amount of sea-sickness; encountered a severe gale off Hatteras, but finally arrived at this Island on the 12th inst., without accident. May of the men were sick from the close confinement and bad air on ship-board, and three have since died, one a Mr. Edward Gibson from Co. I., and one from Co. B., and one from Co. K., whose names I have not learned.

We found Ship Island a barren waste of white sand, with nothing but sand, no comfort, no relief anywhere, except a small patch of pines on the east end, near five miles from the Fort at this end. The reflection of the rays of the hot sun, is frequently almost blinding; and when the wind blows, (and it exervises this prerogative often) the sand fills the air, and it is drifted into large heaps like snow. We found on the Island about 8000 troops, all from the New England States. Our camping ground was assigned us nearly two miles east of the Fort, (which is on the west point of the Island, ) and we pitched our tents in the sand, built our fires in the sand, our wood we had to pack three miles through the sand; and we dug about six inches deep and took the water to use, out of the sand, and at night we lad our weary bones upon the sand, which persisted in being much damper and harder than good nice sand, for beds, should be. The second day after we landed, there came a severe storm from the south, the wind which had blown hard all day, increased at night, to a hurricane. The sea, or rather the Gulf, broke clear over the Island, for more than half its length. The rain came down in torrents; every precaution was used to keep our tents up. But just after taps, and when we were all turned in for the night, down came our tents like cobwebs before the blast. Morning at length came, and with it a clear sky, and better prospects.

On the 15th, the great mortar fleet, 25 sail, with several gun boats and "men of war," set sail, to attack some rebel fort. I think Fort Jackson on the Mississippi river. We have heard some heavy firing since, but have not learned the result. yesterday, some of the boys killed an alligator at the upper end of the Island, and floated him down on a raft; he seemed great suriosity to most of the soldiers. A ship with a New Hampshire regiment came in this morning, but I have not ben able to learn the number of the regimet, or the name of the ship; she had been oar twenty days on the trip, and brought no news.

There are not inhabitants, no living thing on this Island, (that we know of except soldiers and horses. 'Tis a gloom, desolate spot, and sooner we leave it, the better it will suit. As we are anious to finish our work and get home as soon as may be.

There are a thousand -and -one lite incidents that might be interesting, but a soldier's writing facilities are limited, and it is no leasant task to sit in the sand and write upon your knee, with a poor pen. The health of the Company is usually good, there are none considered dangerous ill.
