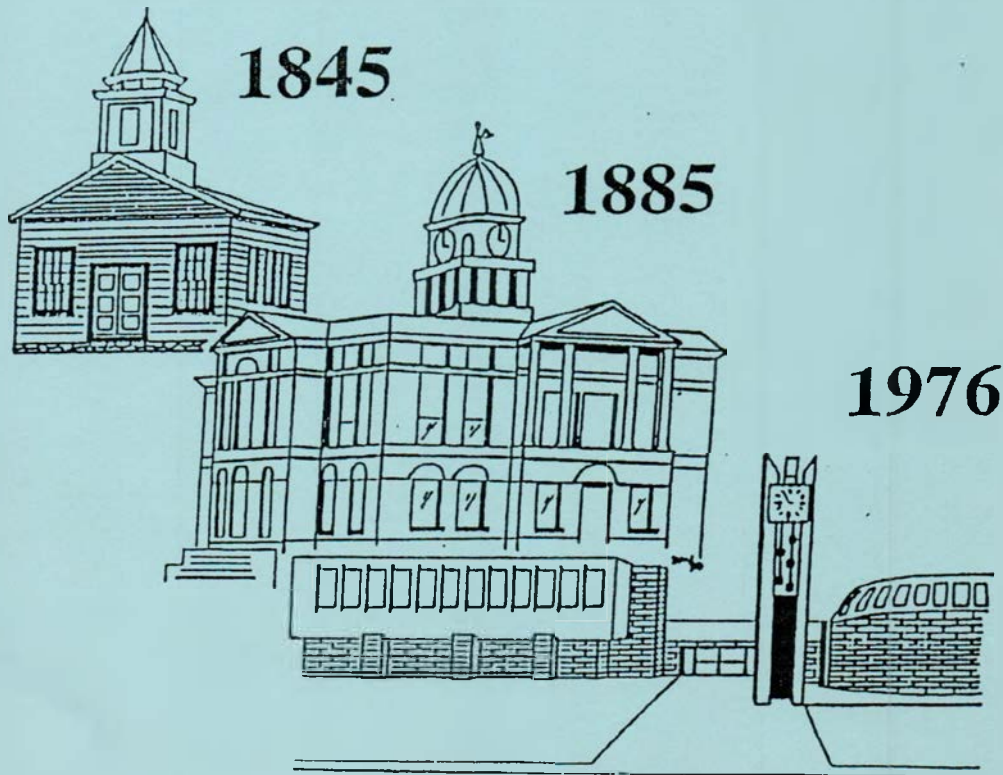

DO YOU KNOW ??

ECGS --300.12

In the period of the violent anti-slavery sentiment in the northern states just prior to the Civil war "underground railway" stations were established in Michigan. The line usually brought the escaping Negro slaves through Coldwater, Battle Creek, Jackson, Ann Arbor and Detroit to Canada and freedom. The sub-stations for rest and food, were located about 15 miles apart. The "stationmaster" at Battle Creek was a Quaker and very active in aiding the Negroes and keeping the line open into Canada where hundreds of escaped slaves found a haven.

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Letters From Our Volunteers Charlotte Republican Newspaper Dated May 23, 1862

Pittsburg Lansing, Tenn.
May 21, 1862

Friend Saunders: ----- There has but little of interest transpired with us since my last. We have been marched around the county enough to give variety to life, and that is all. After we were attached to McClernand's Division we advanced by easy marches to within one mile of Monterey. At that place we remained nearly a week, when the inefficiency of our Regiment becoming daily more apparent, we were sent back to the Landing. We are completely decimated by disease. Not very many have died, but the hospitals are over-full of the sick. We have been here about ten days and our condition has not improved. Those who are able, are performing guard and picket duty under direction of the provost-marshal.

Our sick are sadly neglected, and in many cases greatly abused. Our surgeons are a nuisance. **Gen. John A. Logan** said publicly that they were not worth hell-room. Ever since **Dr. Kedzie** left us we have received no care. He was universally liked in the Reg't and the boys all wish him back again. The following is a list of the sick and dead from Eaton County as nearly as I can ascertain:

Philip Stine of Walton died on a hospital boat bound for the north. **Henry Stine**, **Geo. A. Fink**, **Wm. Fink** and **Martin Sprague** of Walton, sick and sent north --- place unknown. **Wm. Nettleton** of Walton, in hospital at Hamburg, three miles above this place on the river. **Mr. Stroupe**, **Emory Fink**, and myself from

Walton, and **Daniel Hubbard** of Brookfield, sick and off duty, but not in hospital.

C.O. Jamill, **Jesse Hayward**, **Geo. Loveless** and **D.C. Young** of Grand Ledge, sick and sent northward. **Simeon Reynolds** of Oneida sick and in hospital here. **Samuel Chadwick**, **Wm. Russell** and **R. Joslyn** of Grand Ledge sick but not in hospital.

Gov. Blair is here. The boys, or many of them at least, think we shall see better treatment hereafter. It is to be hoped that we may.

Before closing I must acknowledge the regular receipt of your paper, for which accept my hearty thanks. A soldier loves to hear from home. Yours truly,

Died:

Capt. Philo W. Rogers, of Co. B., 2d Mich, Cavalry Regiment, died in Military Hospital No. 1, Evansville, Indiana, on the 16th day of May, 1862, of Typhoid Fever.

At a special communication of Eaton Rapids Lodge, No 63, of F.& A.M., of which the deceased was a member, held May 21, 1862, the following preamble and resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Whereas, It has please the Divine Architect of the Universe to agin claim one of our chosen few, and to remove from a field of usefulness at a time of our country's greatest need, our esteemed brother, **Philo W. Rogers**, under circumstances peculiarly trying, in a strange land and among strangers, with no kind or beloved friend to minister to his wants, or to receive his dying message to kind parents or beloved wife or friends.

Eaton County Quest

Resolved, That in the death of Capt. **Philo W. Rogers** the county has lost a brave and upright officer; the wife a beloved husband; the parents a dutiful son; the lodge an esteemed brother; the community a worthy citizen.

Resolved, That we tender our heartfelt sympathies to her who, after almost superhuman efforts to be with and minister to the wants of a beloved and dying husband, was too late, death having claimed his victim a few hours before.

Resolved, That while our Hall, draped in mourning, reminds us that death has claimed tribute from our mystic circle, we feel impelled to say that he who has gone from his labors on earth, and whose loss we now mourn, possessed as many virtues and as few faults as ordinarily fall to the lot of man. Over the latter we will cheerfully cast the mantle of charity; and with us the former need no marble monument to perpetuate their memory.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be presented to the Wife of our late Brother, to the parents, and to our county papers for publication.

In Bellevue, on the 23d inst., **Eward Fitch**, age 22 years.

Mr. F. enlisted in Co. H., 13th Mich. Inf., Jan. 17th, 1862, and while in camp at Kalamazoo was taken with the measles, but so far recovered as to be able to go with the regiment to Kentucky. On arriving at Bowling Green he was again taken sick, and about the 10th of April was removed to Hospital No 4 at Louisville, where he had the typhoid fever and typhoid pneumonia. He was reduced to a mere skeleton. On the 19th inst. he was discharged, and his brother,

who enlisted with him, brought him home to Bellevue where he arrived on Wednesday the 21st. He died on Friday, his disease finally taking the form of consumption.

In Camp, near Corinth, Miss, May 10th, 1862, of typhoid fever, **Wm. A. Frace**, son of **Joseph and Catherine Frace**, of Carmel, Eaton County, Mich., aged 16 years 8 months and 25 days.

Hip Gout: Osteomyelitis.

Hives: A skin eruption of smooth, slightly elevated areas on the skin which is redder or paler than the surrounding skin. Often attended by severe itching.

Hospital Fever: See Typhus.

Hydrocephalus: See Dropsy.

Hydrothorax: See Dropsy.

Icterus: See Jaundice.

Inanition: Exhaustion from lack of nourishment; stravation.

Infection: In the early part of the last century, infections were thought to be the propagation of disease by Effluvia (see above) from patients crowded together.

Inflammation: Redness, swelling, pain, tenderness, heat, and disturbed function of an area of the body.

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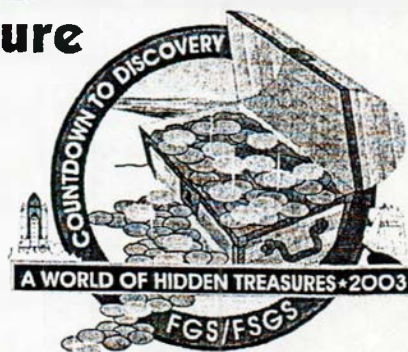

Local items of interest:

John DeGott, of Windsor, is detained at the county bastile for abducting **Anna Frever**, mentioned last week. He will have an examination before **Judge Shaw**, at Eaton Rapids, August 14. The Frever girl is out on bail.

J. Q. Thomas & Co. have had printed at the Leader office this week a large number of bills announcing a general reduction of prices in boots and shoes, from August 3 to 10 inclusive. Odd sizes is the specialty.

Geo. L. Coryell, the Grand Ledge druggist and saloonist, is defendant in a \$10,000 damage suit. **Mrs. Shipman** widow of **Geo. Shipman**, who was recently killed in a runaway accident while in a state of intoxication, is the plaintiff.

Mrs. Lodiaa Hawkins, a pioneer of Vermontville, died last Saturday at the age of 82 years, and it was claimed she was the oldest woman in Eaton county. But **Aunt Polly Robb**, of this city, beats her by seven years, being 89 years old in October.

You needn't think that just because **Bro. Baxter** had a soft snap in Lansing the first six months of 1889, that he can't labor any more. If you think he can't just go past his residence on E. Lovett street and see how nicely he has graded his lawn.

Chas. & Harry Baker are in trouble again. Last week we mentioned that

Davis ---At his home in Eaton, on Monday, May 1, 1893, of consumption, **Mr. J. E. Davis** aged about 70 years.

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McDonald --- At her home on Lovett street, on Monday, January 9, 1893, of tuberculosis, **Mrs. P. M. McDonald**, aged 48 years.

Mrs. McDonald was born in Wilson, Niagara county, New York, May 20, 1844. she had been a resident of Charlotte nearly nineteen years and was a woman of exceptionally noble character. She was for years one of the foremost workers in the Episcopal church where her ability and earnestness were deeply appreciated. She was a member of the Charlotte Woman's Club, her last work in that organization being the preparation of a valuable paper on John Knox. Her mature judgment and sympathetic spirit have been a source of encouragement and help to many a weary heart. Her bereaved daughter has the tender sympathy of everyone. Mrs. McDonald was a very great sufferer and she bore her sufferings bravely and patiently during her long illness. Her two brothers and three sisters, whose homes are in Owosso and Holly, have been with her a great deal during her last illness. The funeral service in this city will be held from the house at 3 o'clock today. **Rector M. H. Marrin** officiating, after which the remains will be taken to Holly where they will be placed beside those of her mother. **Rev. E. G. Lewis** and **Mrs. M. S. Phillips** will go with the friends to Holly where another service will be held from the home of **Mrs. L. M. Newell**, a sister of Mrs. McDonald, tomorrow. In accordance with that tender custom which is growing in favor the casket will be carried to its last resting place by near friends.

Peters --- At his home, in Brookfield, of consumption, on Monday morning, January 9, 1893, **James M. Peters**, aged 62 years.

Mr. Peters moved from VanBuren county to Brookfield in June, 1865, where he has ever since been known as one of the prominent men of the township. He refused in early life a good chance to become a lawyer, a profession for which he was well equipped, and stuck to farming, teaching winters until he was about fifty years of age. During the past few years himself and son Charles have been extensively engaged in the manufacture of brick and tile. Mr. Peters' ability has created a demand for his services and he has served at various times as supervisor, clerk, justice of the peace, school inspector, and director in his school district. In 1878 he was a candidate for the office of register of deeds in this county on the greenback ticket receiving 2120 votes to 3182 votes for **John Evans** and 1174 votes for **Hamilton G. McPeck**. Mr. Peters was one of the best posted men in the county and had few equals as a teacher in the common schools of southern Michigan. He had been in very poor health for some time and his friends were fully prepared to hear of his decease. He leaves a wife, four grown up sons and a daughter of fourteen. The funeral will be held today from the residence and will be conducted by **Rev. Burge** and the remains will be placed at rest in the Perry cemetery.

Rich --- At the home of his son, **John A. Rich**, in Chester, on Sunday, December 25, 1892, **Benjamin E. Rich**, aged 92 years, 10 months and 17 days.

Mr. Rich was one of the earliest settlers of the county, having come to Chester about half century ago. He was probably the oldest mason in the state, having joined that order in 1823. His name appears the fourth on the list of charter members of Charlotte lodge. Mr. Rich was a life long democrat and a man

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of strict integrity. His funeral was held under Masonic order at the Gresham M. E. church, yesterday, **Rev. A. E. North** officiating.

Higby --- At her home on Clinton street, on Friday morning, February 17, 1893, **Mrs. Ann Higby**, widow of the late **Frank W. Higby**, aged 54 years and 8 days.

Mrs. Higby had been in her usual health and seemed to be particularly cheerful the evening before when her son-in-law, **Mr. George H. Spencer**, called at 9 p.m. She had a habit of drawing her couch under the gaslight and falling asleep as she read in the evening and this she seemed to have done and died without waking. She had not undressed for the night and her little 5 year old grandson, **Lawrence Spencer**, who awoke early, was at the couch trying to awaken her when his father called the next morning. Lawrence had been staying with his grandmother nights and was the only person with her in the house when she died. The funeral was held Sunday at 2 o'clock, **Rev. W. B. Williams** officiating. Relatives from a distance attended as follows: **Mrs. H. E. Peabody**, of Elroy, Wis., and **Miss E. J. Dickinson**, of Bradford, Pa., sisters of Mrs. Higby; her son, **Clem Higby** of Little Falls, Minn.; **Miss Catharine Potter**, of Oakland, Cal., and **Mrs. E. M. Spencer**, of Ypsilanti. Mrs. Higby was born of Quaker parents in Oneida county, New York, and came to Eaton Rapids, Michigan, when in her seventeenth year. At the age of 18 she married Mr. Higby and very soon after came to Charlotte which has ever since been her home. Mr. Higby, who died nearly two years ago, was for many years one of Charlotte's most reliable business men.

Wetmore --- At his home in this city on Tuesday, April 4, 1893, of heart trouble and old age, **Mr. Clark Wetmore**, aged 81 years and 4 months.

Wigent --- At her home in Benton, January 16, 1893, **Mrs. Martha Wigent**, wife of **D. B. Wigent**, aged 66.

Patten --- At North Lansing, on Thursday, February 9, 1893, **John R. Patten**, an old resident of this city, aged about 75 years. His remains were brought to Maple Hill for interment.

Wack --- In Kalamo, on Tuesday, February 14, 1893, **Mrs. Hannah Wack**, aged 83 years. The funeral will be held at the residence of her son, **Leander Wack**, tomorrow at one o'clock. Mrs. Wack was a pioneer of the county.

See --- At the home of her daughter, **Mrs. Byron Hill**, on the Green farm in this city, on Monday evening, February 13, 1893, **Mrs. Sarah Lee**, aged 78 years. Funeral today at 10 a.m. from the residence, **Rev. Lewis** officiating.

Gardner --- At the home of her daughter-in-law, **Mrs. Frank Sabin**, of West Windsor, on Tuesday, February 7, 1893, **Mrs. Jane Gardner**, aged 92 years.

Mrs. Gardner had resided in Eaton county for about 40 years. Of her six children who grew to maturity and raised families not one is living. The remains were buried at West Windsor on Wednesday.

Dear Mary, hope you are having a good time. Fifty men were here Wed. (and) raised barn. I hired the club to get dinner at Jim Bingham's. Ward happened over yesterday, was here to dinner. It has rained here till it has about spoiled (Oats).

Dora here day of raising I ask Ruth if she was homesick she said no. Alma

Now taking a closer look. The person signing this note is Alma Sarah (Barnes) Butler, Jeptha Butler's wife, Mary's sister in law. Mary and husband Lovell A. Bingham were visiting his brother, Simon P. Bingham, born 1860. It seems that Simon had bought a new Case Steam engine and Thrashing Machine the previous year, and no one knew how to run it properly.

During a visit to Brookfield, Eaton County, Simon had enlisted the help of one of the Beardslee boys, known for their steam engine expertise.

It was decided that it best if Lovell and Mary went with him to South Dakota.

The barn they raised was the barn that still stands on the south side of V drive. west of the Hunt school.

A tornado had been there in Nov of 1911 and they needed a new barn. Jim Bingham's home was across on the north side of the road there. The Ward mentioned here, was Mary and Lovell's son, Ward Bingham.

It was about this time in history Ward married Ina Bell Anderson.

Dora and Ruth were daughters of another one of Lovell's brothers, Ebbin, whose home was on 26 Mile Road near Base Line.

Wouldn't we like a "Guest List" of those present at the raising? Fifty of the pioneer's sons and daughters.

Mary Bingham was a daughter of William and Jane (Clark) Butler. She was one of eight siblings, one was William (Jr) This writer's great grandfather.

Terrible Explosion

The Boiler in a Saw Mill Burst, Killing Two Men

Charlotte, February 9. -----At 7 o'clock this morning the boiler in **Benjamin J. Grier's** large saw mill at Charlotte burst instantly, killing Mr. Grier, the proprietor, and **William Gordon**, the engineer. This mill is situated near the Chicago & Grand Trunk Railroad and not far from the center of the city. The first thing heard was a

Sharp Report

And the air was instantly filled with missiles of every description. The shock jarred the buildings all over Charlotte, and broke lights of glass in some that were blocks away. The mill is

A Total Wreck.

And the building was torn to kindling wood. the boiler, which was of the heaviest kind of iron, and

built in the strongest possible manner, was torn completely in two by the explosion and rolled out perfectly flat. The

Engineer's head was blown off

Thomas Sadler, an employee, was in the mill at the time but escaped without a scratch. Mr. Grier was the most popular and active business man in Charlotte. At the inquest held this afternoon concerning the death of **Benjamin Grier** and **Wm. Gordon**, **Thomas Sadler**, the man who escaped unhurt, gave the following facts concerning the disaster. At one minute to 7 o'clock he came to the mill and Mr. Grier and Gordon stood talking together. As Sadler passed up stairs Mr. Grier stood near the boiler with his watch in one hand and the whistle cord in the other, ready to blow the whistle as he often did. As Sadler stepped back from the stairs about ten feet from him he heard a sound and dust was thrown upon him.

Timbers Began to Fall,

And realizing that an explosion had occurred, he stooped down. Timbers fell on every side of him, and machinery weighing about a ton fell from above, just touching his clothes. He then called to Mr. Grier, but receiving no answer, crawled out of the ruins. The spot where Sadler stood is the only one in the building where he would not have been instantly killed. Mr. Grier was blown

Ten Feet Through A Partition.

Among timbers, and was pinned to the ground by the large saw frame from above. His neck was broken, also his legs and arms. He received several other wounds and his

Skull was crushed,

It was nearly an hour after help arrived before he could be extricated. **William Gordon**, the engineer, had his head blown entirely off and was found twenty feet from where he stood when the explosion occurred. He had worked in this mill and another one, which burned, over twenty years. Grier's mills seemed fated as two others standing on that spot had burned. The other men who worked in the mill were all providentially late this morning, and this alone saved them.

A Strange Incident,

Occurred last night. Mr. Grier slept with his oldest boy, a lad of 9 years, and before he fell asleep told him he felt that he should not live long, but wished him to be good and take care of his mother. At the inquest no cause for the explosion was found. Sadler thought the boiler had plenty of water, but that they had nearly

Twice The Usual Amount Of Steam,

On for starting. Nothing further will probably ever be known. Mr. Grier had lived here for a

score of years and was loved by all. Today a pall hangs over the city as though each family had lost a member. Mr. Grier leaves a family of five small children and a mother. The family are well provided for.

To the Clerk of the County of *Eaton*

This list has been compiled and is forwarded to you, under instructions contained in a Joint Resolution of the Legislature of Michigan, approved January 17, 1862. The delay in procuring returns from the Regiments in the field, together with a desire to add to the list the names of volunteers enlisting in Regiments which have been mustered into service during the fall months, necessarily deferred the completion of the record beyond the time originally contemplated.

Information concerning the *status* of the volunteers whose names are given, as well as that in regard to their being married or unmarried, is based (with the exceptions hereafter noted,) upon special returns to this Department, verified by the commanding officers of companies.

The details of *casualties* are derived from the same special returns, and from the regular "Monthly Returns" of Regiments. Although noted on official authority, there may be occasional errors, in exceptional cases, especially in the record of *discharges*, as stragglers on a march, or after an engagement, and disabled soldiers absent without the knowledge of their officers, are sometimes, under the rigid rules of the service, accounted for as deserters where no other information concerning them can be procured. These instances, however, are but rare.

The special returns which have been referred to as showing the residence of volunteers, are wanting in the cases of Company D, First Infantry; Companies A, B, C and G, Ninth Infantry; First, Fourth and Fifth Batteries; and Willet's Sharpshooters. The place of enlistment, as shown by the muster rolls, is given as the residence of the men in these companies.

Except in a very few instances, casualties reported since the 8th of September, have not been entered on these lists. It was necessary to adopt a uniform period at which the record should cease, and a later date could not safely be fixed.

These lists include the Infantry Regiments, from the First to the Twenty-Sixth inclusive; the Cavalry, from the First to the Ninth inclusive; the First Mechanics and Engineers; the two Michigan companies in the "Merrill Horse"; the Batteries, First to Ninth inclusive; all the Michigan Sharpshooters (six companies) now in active service; McDermott's Company in the Mulligan (Ill.) Regiment; and the "Blanton Guard," enlisted to guard rebel prisoners at Mackinac—now disbanded. The First Regiment of Three Months' volunteers was mustered out of service before these books were contemplated, and left no record of the residence of those connected with it. The Twenty-Seventh and Twenty-Eighth Infantry, Seventh, Eighth and Ninth Cavalry, First Sharpshooters, and the Tenth and Eleventh Batteries, yet incomplete and remaining in the State, together with the Recruits which have joined Regiments in the field since July 1st, 1862, will be included, should the present system continue, in future lists similar in character to this.

Companies from this State, numbering in the aggregate over 1,200 men, who joined Regiments of other States during the year 1861, are not included in these lists, the organizations to which they are attached not being embraced in the records of this Department, and having no official connection therewith.

The entire number of names which have been classified under the Resolution of the Legislature, and which are now sent in separate lists to the several counties in the State, is 39,139. The men in each company and regiment are classed together.

It can hardly be necessary to impress upon the county officers who are made the custodians of these books, the importance of their preservation. This is not only due to the brave men whose names are enrolled in them, but should be a matter of pride on the part of the county. Fifty years hence, the public records will contain no more interesting memorials of the present age than are herewith entrusted to your safe-keeping.
