

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Pre-1850 Census Birth Calculation Table

(Used by Roger Joslyn at the Michigan Genealogical Council Seminar of 2001)

This chart can be used to quickly calculate the approximate period in which a person was born, base on the indicated age group. The math is simply a matter of subtraction of the age group spans from the census year. For example, for the 1810 Census, one age column was "of 16 and under 26." This means the person was already 16 years old by census day in 1810, and therefore was born no later than 1794. If the person was "under 26," or 25, then the birth was no earlier than 1785. However, the birthday could have occurred after census day, with the person turning 26 later in the census year, in which case the birth could have been in 1784.

Brown's Directory of Eaton County, MI 1872 – 1873 By Vicki L Dukes

Chester Station (population about 55 in May 1872) a small settlement in the Chester Township, situated about 7 miles nearly west of Charlotte, was laid out and platted as a village in the fall of 1870 by George Brenner, John Betts George Lamie, and Felix Omspocker, who settled here from seventeen to twentyone years ago. The Grand River Valley Railroad opened its line through here about three years since. Mr. J. H. Thomas filled the position of station agent for the Company. The present station agent is Mr. P. B. Bower. Mr. E. J. Whitright is post master, express agent and a general dealer in groceries and provisions; store on the east side of Blair Street.

Measrs Garton and Davenport

commenced to run their saw mill here in April 1871. They operated one circular saw in their mill, cut principally hard wood lumber, average about eight thousand feet per day. They also own and operate another mill in Eaton Rapids, one in Hartford, Kansas and give employment to from six to eight men in each of their four mills.

As yet there is no hotel at this point.

The names of their streets as platted are: East, Spring, Grove, Grand, Blair, West, North, Minty, Oak, Elm, South, and Lynn.

Thomas Anderson settled here in the month of April 1852 where he has since resided. He has a store on lot one block one; residence the same. Anderson, Thomas W., dry goods, groceries, drugs, confectionery, etc; e a Blair; res. same.

Centennial Farms By Mary Jean Baker

It wasn't until 1948 that the Michigan Historical Commission inaugurated a centennial farm program. Farms earning this certification had to prove that the same land was used by the same family for over one hundred years. The purpose of this program was to emphasize the important contribution which Michigan centennial farm families have made over a century.

Shortly after the program began, Consumers Power Company, recognizing the importance of agriculture to the state, added materially to the program. The money helped make available a large metal marker, which informed the public that the farm was a centennial farm. (1)

More recently honored by the State of Michigan for their Sesquicentennial Farm are **Ray and Martha Lawrence**, whose family has occupied the same farm land for over 165 years. The farm's history began with **James Southworth** settling in Eaton Township in February 1837, after coming from New York State. A log house was built, without a hired hand, during the winter of 1837. **James** became a capable farmer by clearing 80 acres of land. Prior to 1840, the land he occupied was inhabited by some Potawatomi and Chippewa Indian tribes.

Myron Southworth carried on in his father's footsteps with his wife **Bertha**, farming 207 acres with oxen. The youngest of their four children, another **Bertha**, was next to occupy the land with her husband, **Lawrence**. **Lawrence and Bertha Southworth** both passed away in 1988, leaving the farm to their children, **David, Roberta and Martha**.

In 1989, **Martha and Ray Lawrence** moved from their home in Arizona and purchased the farm. Not many people can raise their children saying, "These are the same doors your grandfather walked through when he was growing up", Martha said.

Other recent Centennial Farms include Julie and Gary Burt of Mulliken. Their farm has been in the family since 1860, starting with Julie's great-great-grandfather John Ewing. His son Horace Ewing passed the farm to Robert Ewing, Julie's grandfather and then her father, Richard L Ewing, passed it on to his daughter the Burt's.

A farm owned by **Beatrice Parker Kerr**, located on Wheaton Road, Grand Ledge has been in the family since 1860. A 40 acre farm owned by **Carroll Tharp**, located on Kinsel Highway has been in the family since 1892.

An article in the Charlotte Shopping Guide from November 12, 2000 lists other centennial farms as follows: Martha Zemke, Brown Road, Vermontville and Kathryn DePuy, W. Mt Hope Hwy., Grand Ledge. Ivan & Pat Mott of Olivet, Elbert & Dorothy Carpenter, Duane & Kim Eldred, and Stanley & Darleen Hosey, of Vermontville; Ron & Harriet Converse, Steve & Donna Davidson, Calvin & Doris Fullerton, Lloyd & Barbara Haun, Mary Russ, Richard and Lillian Schroeder, Ruth Shepard, Joe & Lou Ann Stachnik, Paul & Sharon Upright, Ion & Leona Upright, Phyllis Wendel, Adam & Donyeallie Wheaton, and D. Phillip Williams of Charlotte; Durwood Dow, Ella O'Neil, Donald & Esther Roth, and Neil & Marjorie Southworth all of Mulliken; Edgar & Rosa Fleetham of Sunfield; Mary Lou Southworth of Grand Ledge; Edward & Roberta Ribby and Dale & Norine Winslow of Eaton Rapids.

A centennial farm is classified as "a working farm of ten or more acres that has been continuously owned by the same family for at least 100 years." The Michigan Historical Commission also has established a Sesquicentennial Farm Program to recognized certified farms that have been owned by the same family for 150 years or longer.

Past and Present of Eaton County

Abstracted by Vicki L Dukes

William J. Bateman is one of the alert and progressive business men and representative citizens of Dimondale, where he conducts a well equipped general store. He is of the third generation of his family in Eaton County, where his paternal grandfather settled prior to the admission of the state to the Union.

Mr. Bateman was born on the homestead farm, in Hamlin Township, this county, October 3, 1872, and is a son of Norman P. and Orpha (Smith) Bateman, both of whom were born in Hamlin Township, this county. The former is a son of Daniel Bateman, who came from the state of New York to Eaton County in 1836, taking up one hundred and sixty acres of government land in the midst of the virgin forest. He was a millwright by trade and followed this vocation prior to coming to Michigan. He reclaimed one hundred and twenty acres of his land to cultivation, selling the remaining forty acres. He held the homestead in his possession for many years and continued his residence in Eaton County until his death, which occurred in 1882, his wife having passed away in 1856. They were numbered among the sterling pioneers of the county and he was prominent and influential in local affairs of a public nature. Norman P. Bateman was the eldest son, and his educational training was received in the school at Spicerville, Hamlin Township, and one of his

teachers was **J. C. Sherman**, long known as one of the representative citizens of Charlotte.

Mr. Bateman assisted in the work of the home farm until he was eighteen years of age, when he turned from the plowshare to the sword, going forth in defense of the Union. In December 1863, he enlisted in Company H, Sixth Michigan Volunteer Infantry, with which he continued in active service twentyone months, or until the close of the war, having taken part in a number of the historic battles of the great conflict between the states and having been mustered out in the city of Jackson, Michigan, duly receiving his honorable discharge.

After the close of his faithful and valiant military career the youthful veteran returned to his home. in Eaton County, and he was identified with agricultural pursuits in Hamlin Township until 1868, when he removed to Windsor Township and took up his residence on a farm of one hundred and twenty acres, two miles distant from Dimondale. He made excellent improvements on the place, which is one of the valuable farms of the county and which he still owns, though he has lived retired in the village of Dimondale since 1902. His wife is a daughter of William Smith, one of the venerable pioneers of Hamlin Township, where he still resides on the farm which has been his home for half a century.

Norman P. Bateman is a stanch Republican, and he served two years as treasurer of Windsor Township and two years as township supervisor. He is affiliate with the Grand Army of the Republic and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, and he and his wife are supporters of the Methodist Protestant church of Dimondale.

William J. Bateman, the immediate subject of this sketch, was reared on the home farm and secured his educational discipline in the public schools. After leaving school, he accepted a position as a clerk in a store. In 1890 he took up his residence in Dimondale, where he served two years as deputy postmaster, after which he was in the employ of the Lake Shore & Michigan Southern Railroad Company at this place for a period of four years. He then opened a general store in the village, and has built up a most flourishing business, his fair dealings and personal popularity having gained to him a representative patronage, while he keeps an excellent stock in each department of his store. He owns the building in which his store is established and also an attractive residence in the village.

In politics **Mr. Bateman** is unswerving in his support of the principles of the Republican Party, and he served two terms as township treasurer and one year as township clerk. He is affiliated with the Independent Order of the Odd Fellows, the Knights of the Maccabees, the Modern Woodmen of America, and the Mystic Workers. At the time of the Spanish-American War he was recruiting officer in Company L., Thirty-third Michigan Volunteer Infantry, drawing its members from the Sons of Veterans, of which order he is an appreciative member.

February 22, 1893, **Mr. Bateman** was united in marriage to **Miss Minnie Bell**, daughter of **James and Lucia (Gates) Bell**, well known citizens of Dimondale and honored pioneers of the county. **Mrs. Bateman** is a member of the local Presbyterian Church and is prominent in the religious and social affairs of the community.

Harrison Beard is one of the progressive and public-spirited citizens of Charlotte, where he is successfully established in the dairy and fruit farming business. He was born in Huron County, Ohio, June 12, 1836, and is the son of Elijah and Lucy (Horn) Beard.

His father was born in the dominion of Canada, in 1788 and died in Steuben County, Indiana, in 1872. His wife was born in Canada, in 1799, and passed the closing years of her life in Steuben County, Indiana, where she died in 1879. Her great-grandmother was Elizabeth Chamberlain.

This worthy couple became the parents of thirteen children, one of whom died in infancy; **Franklin** died in 1902; **Charles** died a number of years ago; **Jane** became the wife of **Ananiah Gifford** and is now deceased; Phoebe became the wife first, of Joseph Probasco, second of John Breckenridge, and third of Samuel Langley, and is now deceased; Elijah is deceased; Herman is deceased; Newman resides in Steuben County, Indiana; Harrison, subject of this sketch, was the next in order of birth; Mary, deceased, was the wife of Humphry Foster; Henry is deceased; Harriet resides in Angola, Indiana, and Albert also is a resident of Steuben County, Indiana.

The parents were married in Canada, where they maintained their home until 1831, when they removed to Ohio and located in Ripley Township, Huron County, where they remained a short time. The father then purchased eighty acres of wild land in Sherman Township, of that county, erecting a log house on the place and clearing a portion of the land, which he later gave to his sons, who reclaimed the remainder. The subject of this sketch well recalls this pioneer farm, and on one occasion saw dogs chase a deer through the barnyard of the place.

In 1848 Elijah Beard removed to Steuben County, Indiana, where he traded two teams of horses for eighty acres of timbered land, improving the property and continuing resident of that county until his death.

He was originally an old-line Whig in politics, but united with the Republican Party at the time of its organization and ever afterward gave his support to the same. He and his wife were members of the Baptist Church. Two of their sons, **Henry** and Newman, were valiant soldiers of the Union in the war of the Rebellion.

Harrison Beard passed his boyhood days in his native county, having been about twelve years of age at the time of his parents' removal to Indiana, where he was reared to maturity, having received such educational advantages as were afforded in the pioneer schools of Ohio and Indiana. At the age of eighteen years he began working by the month, as a farm hand, and later learned the blacksmith trade, which he followed as a vocation for some time, at the expiration of which he resumed his association with agricultural pursuits.

In 1863 he came to Michigan and purchased one hundred and sixty acres of heavily timbered land in Muskegon Township, Muskegon County. He was accompanied by his wife and two children and they made the journey of one hundred and sixty miles, from Branch County, MI on the Indiana state line with an ox team, taking their stock with them. He made a clearing on the place and erected a log house fourteen feet square, and a log barn. Later he replaced these by more pretentious frame structures.

The first year he prepared the land and set out one thousand peach trees, and about an acre of grapes. The first year of bearing he harvested from this orchard \$300 worth of peaches and \$100 worth of grapes. The country was at that time very wild, and the deer so numerous that **Mrs. Beard**, in her husband's absence, had frequently to drive them away from the growing wheat. **Mr. Beard** often killed them in his own yard. This was their second experience in pioneering, as they had already realized the hardship of life in a new country in Indiana.

He reclaimed one hundred and twenty-five acres of the farm, to which he added by subsequent purchases until he had two hundred and forty acres, devoting his attention to general farming and to the raising of peaches and grapes.

In 1876 he sold a portion of his land and traded another part for property in the city of Charlotte, near the site of the present court house. He took up his residence in Charlotte at this time, and later traded the property for one hundred acres of land in Benton Township, one-half of which he reclaimed from the wild state. In 1882 Mr. Beard traded the remainder of his property in Muskegon County for a house and lot in Charlotte, and the latter he later exchanged for twenty-seven vacant lots, his present residence being situated on a portion of this property. He exchanged his farm in Benton Township for property in the village of Lake Odessa, Ionia County. This last mentioned property he later sold.

In the summer of 1887 he erected his present residence, in which he took up his abode in November of that year. On his land he set out fruit trees and also prepared for the raising of various kinds of small fruits, thereafter devoting his attention principally to the raising of fruit until 1899, when he engaged in the dairy business and continues to raise fruit on a smaller scale.

At the time of their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Beard were worth just \$80; but their property is now worth between \$4,000 and \$5,000. This marriage was solemnized on the 7th of November 1859. Mrs. Beard was Miss Francina Stratton, who was born in Morrow County, Ohio December 5, 1841. Her father, Francis Stratton, was born May 23, 1816 and died February 5, 1880. Her mother, whose maiden name was Susannah Cowles, was born in Onondaga County, New York, February 26, 1826 and her death occurred July 25, 1878.

In 1852 **Mr. Stratton** removed from Ohio to Indiana, where he purchased and partially improved a farm of eighty acres. Later he sold this and bought sixty acres, which later he sold and purchased another sixty acres. He sold this property and soon after the close of the Civil War removed to Muskegon County, MI., where he purchased eighty acres of wild land he reclaimed to cultivation.

In 1877 he sold the farm and purchased ninety acres in Rutland Township, Barry County and continued to make his home there for many years. His wife died there and he passed his closing years of life in Charlotte with his eldest daughter, **Mrs. Beard**. The other two children are **Alice**, wife of **Frank Johnston** a farmer in Rutland Township, Barry County; and **Elnora** wife of **William Myers**, residing in California. **Mr. and Mrs. Stratton** were devout members of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and his political allegiance was to the Republican Party.

Mr. and Mrs. Beard had five children. Elsie was born March 24. 1860, and is the wife of Peter Ochambaugh, of VanBuren County, MI, Alma and Blanche are deceased. Ralph was born in 1890, Joseph born in 1892 and Evangeline was born in 1897. Ellsworth Beard was born April 18, 1863 and died August 18, 1865. Frank was born November 10 1867, and is engaged in the drug business in Charlotte, a member of the Beard & Vickerv firm. He married Miss Alma Shaw and they have one child, Hazel, born February 8, 1895. Effie, the fourth child, was born May 16, 1871 and died at 3 months. Frederick H. was born June 8, 1872 and has a merchandise business in Angola, Indiana, known as the "Rachet" store with his brother Frank. Fred married Miss Belle Sowers and they have one child, Carroll, born May 2, 1898.

Harrison Beard gave his unwavering support to the Republican Party and he and his wife were members of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

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
