

Dolson automobile a featured exhibit in RE Olds Transportation Museum

The Pray family, Friends of the Dolson, and the RE Olds Transportation Museum have agreed on a winter exhibit featuring the 1907 Dolson automobile.

"We are excited that the RE Olds Transportation Museum is eager to show the Dolson for the winter" said Joe E. Pray, one of the owners of the Dolson auto.

"This will make a great exhibit and further our mission of presenting transportation manufactured in and around greater Lansing," said Mr. Bill Adcock, Director of the RE Olds Transportation Museum.

The car will remain on display through early May at the museum along with other no-table examples of the Brass Era of automobiles, including REOs and Oldsmobiles.

known auto left from the com-pany that manufactured autos in Charlotte from 1902 to 1908. The Dolson family, led by John Dolson and his two sons changed their company from building wagons to auto manufacturing in 1902 when they built their first prototype automobile. They started automobile production in 1903 and produced an estimated 700 automobiles until they were forced to close their doors in 1908 due to financial pressures.

The car featured a number of components that were found in many other high quality cars of its day," said Manny Dragone of Dragone Classic Motorcars, "it was a well built car."

Many of the advertisements for the Dolson featured its du-

rability, which was proven in at least two well-known endurance tests of its era — the 1906 Chica-go Endurance Challenge and the 1907 Round The Kite Challenge From San Francisco to Santa Fe.

The large touring car from the brass era of classic cars features a four-cylinder engine made by Milwaukee Engine Company with a three-speed transmission. Although the Dolson has been restored, it still features it's original leather interior.

This particular Dolson was most likely bought by its original owner in Boston in 1907 from the Imperial Motorcar Company, a Dolson Dealership. Then after several years of service an owner sold it to the Garganigo Brothers who owned a scrap yard just outside of Boston. Many early cra cars were scrapped after only

a few years. Al Garganigo, one of the brothers decided to save a few of the cars that were more interesting to start an attrac-tion at his filling station to draw people in to buy gas. Fortunately this Dolson was one of those lucky cars saved from the scrap pile. The car was held in the arganigo collection until it was sold to another museum where it stayed until it was sold at auction in Florida in 1986.

'A group of local people

had chased this car for 35 years to bring it back to Charlotte," said Pray. Twenty-five years ago the original group, Friends of the Dolson was formed to raise funds to buy the car at auction in Florida. The group was outbid and the car disappeared from the public view until a private col-lector sold it, along with several other cars, to Mr. Dragone four years ago. It changed hands through one more dealer until Mr. Pray and an interested group

of owners was able to purchase it at an auction in Plymouth, Mich.

last August. The car will appear at local events in the area to promote both the history of the region's automobile history as well as the history of its hometown of Charlotte. The factory where the Dol-son was built still stands at the comer of Pearl and Lovett streets in Charlotte.

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
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William and Spencer Moon Said to Have Been Oldest Twins in the United States

Charlotte, Dec 2 – One of the oldest pair of living twins in the United States, if not in the world, was that distinction borne by Spencer C. Moon, long-time resident of Eaton County who died recently and his brother, Dr. William P. Moon of Coudesport, Potter County, Pa. who were born September 25, 1825, in Schenectady, N. Y., and consequently are in their 96th year.

Spencer Moon lived for years with his daughter, Mrs. Rachel Barker, in Roxand township, but for the past couple of years has been residing in Lansing where he died Friday night after a few weeks' illness. The body was brought to Needmore cemetery. Mr. Moon was the father of three children. Mrs. R. Barker of Lansing and Mrs. C. C. Russell, and John Moon of Colton, Cal.

Dr. William Moon was connected with a hospital in Philadelphia for 20 years, but with advancing age retired to a quiet home in Potter County, Pa. He bears a close resemblance to the late Mayor Gaynor of New York city, for whom he was often mistaken. He has no children.

The Moon twins were both veterans of the Civil war, and their father, Benjamin Thompson Moon, was also a soldier, serving through the war of 1812. Unlike the usual characteristic attributed to twins, they did not in the least resemble each other physically, nor did their tastes run alike. They had not seen each other in many years.
